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PREFACE

The first issues of the Cross National Summaries in the Comparative Studies series provide basic information, documentation and results of the World Fertility Survey for the nineteen countries which had their First Country Reports and Standard Recode Tapes available at the beginning of 1980.

Despite the efforts made by WFS to maintain comparability of question wording and content, field procedures and specifications of the tabulations and analysis included in the First Country Reports, it was inevitable that differences would arise as a result of the importance attached to meeting specific requirements of the countries themselves. A major attempt to enhance and facilitate comparability has been the production of Standard Recode Tapes for each country, with all the core information coded and stored in a consistent order, together with the dictionaries which provide detailed specifications for all variables.

Several of the Cross National Summaries will be concerned solely with providing detailed and systematized information on the comparability (or lack thereof) of the field procedures, survey characteristics, questionnaire content and wording and content of the First Country Reports. Such detailed appraisals constitute an essential reference base for anyone using WFS data for comparative analysis.

Other volumes of the Cross National Summaries will present comparable results from as many surveys as possible. These volumes will present the basic data from the surveys over a wide range of specific topics. In addition to the tabular material, there will be a brief accompanying text, which will draw attention primarily to any non-comparability of the data and to any obvious interpretational pitfalls to which the tables may be subject: for example many summary indices are subject to composition differences, which are often reduced by standardization. Finally, although these volumes are not intended to be analytic in their orientation, some brief highlighting of the major noteworthy differences and similarities is included.

We hope that these Cross National Summaries will be widely used, especially by persons in the international community who are making cross national comparisons. We also hope that the sub-series will help users to avoid assuming too much comparability when this is not the case and to avoid interpretational mistakes which can easily arise when data are presented without qualification.

EXPLANATION OF SYMBOLS USED IN TABLES

- ✓ Means that the variable was used, exactly as recommended. In the case of demographic variables, the subgroups (for example five-year age groups) were used as recommended. In the case of background variables, this symbol indicates that the variable was used, but the categories of each variable will differ among countries (see Appendix 1 for categories).
- 0 Means that that particular variable was not used, although the table exists in the country report.
- Not Included Means that the entire table was omitted from the report.
- <15 . . . 25+ Listed under recommended categories 15–19, 20–24, 25–29, 30+ means that changes were made at both ends of the variable, adding a group <15 at the lower end, and collapsing at the upper end, combining the 25–29 and 30+ groups into a 25+ group. Between the two extremes, however, the recommended groups were used.
- [H3] Table numbers enclosed in square brackets indicate that the number for that table was neither the old nor the new number but a number specific to that country.

1. INTRODUCTION

This paper examines the comparability of tables published in the First Country Reports of WFS surveys. Each report has an extensive set of tables that summarize the results of the survey. As these reports will be used as a data source for comparative research in fertility, there arises the need to know the comparability of the tables in these reports. Non-comparabilities in the tables are largely the result of variations in recoding for tabulation purposes and in the construction of variables, but differences in questionnaire content are also important. Research limitations imposed by questionnaire differences are shown for a few constructed variables, but for a detailed comparison of questionnaires, another paper in this series of Comparative Studies — Comparability of Questionnaires (No. 2) — should be consulted.

In Guidelines for Country Report No. 1, WFS suggested tables that should be produced. This present Cross National Summary shows the major differences between the recommended tabulations and the tabulations published. In the Guidelines, tabulations are considered in five groups, and this grouping is followed here: Nuptiality and Exposure to Child-bearing, Fertility, Preferences for Number and Sex of Children, Knowledge and Use of Contraception, and Use of Contraception in relation to Fertility Preferences. In further explanation of the published tables, two appendices are included. Appendix I shows the background variables, by categories, used in the reports. Appendix II lists the various household and detailed birth history tables and also any additional tables that appear, but no comparison between the tables is attempted.

In this present paper, each table recommended in the Guidelines for Country Report No. 1 (as updated in December 1977) is considered separately, and country tables are compared with the tables recommended as standard. Deviations from recommendations are noted in respect of the following:

- (1) Use or non-use of a table.
- (2) Categories of variables used (other than background variables).
- (3) Background variables used.
- (4) Definitions of constructed variables, such as 'exposure status, and 'pattern of contraceptive use'.
- (5) Use or definition of base population, e.g. 'exposed' or 'currently married, "fecund"'.

The major variations are commented on briefly in a discussion preceding the detailed comparison of the tables.

The updating of the Guidelines for Country Report No. 1 resulted in two systems of numbering tables — that of the old Guidelines and that of the new, here referred to as the 'old' and the 'new'. Where these differ, both the old and new numbers are given for the table; otherwise, the same number is used. The old system of numbering was used by Malaysia, Nepal, Pakistan, Colombia, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, and Panama; Thailand also used this system, but with some variations. Fiji and Indonesia used systems that are quite different from both the old and new. All other countries used the new system, although an occasional variation does occur. Whenever table numbers differ from both the old and the new systems, the country's own table number is noted in square brackets opposite the country's name.

2. SUMMARY OF MAJOR VARIATIONS FROM RECOMMENDED STANDARDS

Demographic Variables

Current Age: A major variation in the current age variable is the omission by Panama and Costa Rica of the 15–19 age

group from their samples. This results in non-comparability of the 5-year age groups and also the 10-year age groups, since these were 20–29, 30–39 and 40–49, as compared to the standard groups of 15–24, 25–34, 35–44 and 45–49. A second variation occurs in some countries that have a very low age at marriage and where women under 15 years old were interviewed. This difference affects comparability, especially in 10-year age groups, when women aged less than 15 are included with the 15–24 group. Pakistan, Malaysia, Sri Lanka, Thailand, and Bangladesh are the countries with some women aged under 15. Fiji also used a non-standard 10-year age-grouping: 15–24, 25–29, 30–39, and 40+.

Age at First Marriage: A significant variation occurs where this variable is used as the means of censoring the population for certain tables, as for example, married before age 25 and aged over 25 at survey. Bangladesh and Jordan used age 20. Where age at marriage was used to create panels in tables (for all such tables, married under age 20 and married over 20 were the recommended panels), changes were made in many countries. In Guyana and Jamaica, 18 was the dividing age; in Indonesia, the panels were under 15, 15–19 and 20 and over; in Bangladesh, the panels were under 10, 10–14, and 15 and over, with an occasional more detailed breakdown; in Thailand the panels were under 20, 20–24 and 25 and over; and in Malaysia, Sri Lanka, Pakistan and Dominican Republic, 25 was occasionally used as the dividing age rather than the recommended age 20. Variations also occur when age at marriage was used as a grouped variable, e.g. when the last open-ended group was recommended as 30 years and over. Pakistan, Panama, Guyana, Jamaica, Fiji, and Indonesia occasionally used 25 and over as their open-ended group. For some variables, Pakistan used 22 and over and Bangladesh used 18 and over. Indonesia and Bangladesh used country-specific breakdowns that differ from those recommended, while Mexico and Nepal occasionally collapsed the recommended categories, resulting in less detailed information for the relevant tables.

Years Since First Marriage: Where a 5-year grouping of duration ending with 30+ years was recommended, Fiji collapsed the last category to 25+, whereas Pakistan, Malaysia, Sri Lanka, Thailand, and Dominican Republic extended it to 30–34 and 35+. Pakistan occasionally used the grouping less than 10, 10–19, and 20+ where a 5-year grouping was recommended; the reverse situation also occurred, and some countries used the 5-year grouping where the 10-year groups were recommended. Occasionally, where the less than 10, 10–19 and 20+ were the recommended groups, Colombia, Costa Rica, and Mexico extended these to include 20–29 and 30+. Finally, some countries in some tables replaced Years Since First Marriage with Age at Marriage.

Marital or Union Status: One means of categorizing this variable was suggested, but it was expected that variation would occur to allow for differences in marriage or union systems within countries. The recommended categories were Married, Widowed, Separated and Divorced. In Nepal and Philippines there is no Divorced group because the questionnaire did not allow for this category. For Jordan, the questionnaire did not include a category Separated, but the report tables included a Separated group, presumably obtained from the probe question on whether husband and wife had stopped living together for good. Colombia, Dominican Republic, Fiji, and Malaysia combined the Divorced and Separated groups in some tables where they should have been identified separately. Mexico created two new groups: Separated or Divorced from a Legal Marriage and Separated or Divorced from a Consensual Union. All Latin

American countries obtained information on whether the type of union was a legal marriage or a consensual union, but for purposes of their reports women in these two groups, when currently in a union, were combined into one group, the equivalent of currently married in other countries. In the case of Guyana and Jamaica, this variable was modified to allow for the different system of union formation. There were three groups of women currently in a union — Legally Married, Commonlaw (equivalent to consensual, i.e. not legally married but cohabiting), and Visiting (in an established sexual relationship, but not cohabiting). The Visiting group is not strictly comparable with marriage or with consensual unions in other countries, since the degree of exposure is lower than for cohabiting unions; however, for purposes of comparison of the tables in the First Country Reports, the sum of these three groups is equivalent to currently married in other countries.

Number Of Times Married: This variable was not available for Nepal, where no question was asked about the number of times a woman had married, since it was assumed that re-marriage was practically non-existent. Pakistan abbreviated the recommended grouping from 1, 2, 3, and 4 or more to 1 and more than one. Guyana and Jamaica added a supplementary country-specific variable, number of partners and replaced the Number of Marriages variable with a variable called Number of Relationships. A woman may have been in more than one type of union with the same partner, and each of these counts as one relationship, but the Number of Partners variable would increase by only one.

Constructed Variables

Exposure Status: The recommended format for this variable contains the following categories:

One variation among countries derives from the recommendation that only contraceptively sterilized women should be included in the Sterilized category. In at least two cases, Fiji and Pakistan, this recommendation was not followed because the question on whether the operation was performed to prevent having children was not asked. From available information it appears that all other countries did use the question to develop the exposure status variable, and thus non-contraceptively sterilized women were classified as Other Impairment. Pakistan has a further non-comparability in regard to the Other Impairment group since only never-users were asked if they considered themselves infecund, although in the Core Questionnaire both never-users and ever-users who were not currently using contraception were asked if they believed themselves to be fecund. Accordingly, in Pakistan the Other Impairment group size may be underestimated, and the Fecund group size overestimated, relative to other countries. Fiji added a group called 'Post Partum Abstinence' which would normally be considered as part of the Fecund group in other countries. Guyana and Jamaica constructed the Exposure Status variable in a non-standard manner, combining the Sterilized and Other Impairment, in order to allow for the division of this

group and of the Fecund group into the three current union status groups, as part of the Exposure Status variable.

In Guyana, the Pregnant group was not constructed in the standard manner. Instead of using only the 'Yes' answers to the question on whether currently pregnant, in Guyana both the 'Yes' and 'Don't Know' answers were used because in the subsequent question on 'expected due date', both groups gave dates.

Pattern of Contraceptive Use: There are two methods of constructing this variable, methods recommended on the basis of whether the Fertility Regulation Module was used or not. If the Module was used the variable has the following categories:

If the Module was not used, no data were collected on use in the last closed interval, and the variable was modified to combine two categories, Use in the Last Closed Interval and Use in Some Earlier Closed Interval. Many countries did not use this variable exactly as recommended, and variations are detailed in Table 4.5.1. A few major deviations are mentioned here. Pakistan completely excluded from this variable women who were not currently married. In Fiji and Pakistan, the absence of the question on whether sterilized for contraceptive use will also affect the size of the Sterilized and Not Married or Not Fecund groups relative to other countries. A further variation is that a few countries combined the Not Married or Not Fecund Never-Users with the group Never-Users Who Do Not Intend Future Use, assuming that they would not use in the future, although the question had not actually been asked in these cases. A few countries put Infecund Past Users into a separate group, resulting in their Other Past User and Sterilized groups being smaller relative to other countries. Guyana and Jamaica did this, but only partially, including Sterilized Infecund women with Sterilized, but separating out Infecund Past Users of other methods. Bangladesh alone separated out not only Infecund Past Users but also Not Married Past Users. Fiji not only separated out Infecund Past Users but also combined the two groups of other past users into one group. Indonesia used a different approach, separating out all Infecund and Not Married women and dividing them into three groups: Used in the Open or Last Closed Intervals; Used in an Earlier Interval; and Never Used.

Mean Number of Additional Children Wanted: As in the case of the Pattern of Contraceptive Use variable, there were two ways of constructing this variable, depending on whether the Fertility Regulation Module was used or not. If the Module was used, a category Last Birth Not Wanted was added, and this group was given the value -1 in the distribution and was included in the calculation of the mean number of additional children wanted. All other categories of the variable were identical, regardless of use of the Module: Women who do not want more children were given the value 0, while those who did want more were given a numerical value of 1 or higher. Those who were undecided about wanting another child were counted in the percent distributions but excluded for calculating the mean.

Some countries did not ask the question on whether the last birth was wanted or asked the question but did not use it to create a special category, considering those who did not want the last birth to be in the group '0'. These countries were Korea, Malaysia, Nepal, Pakistan, Sri Lanka, Thailand, Costa Rica, Guyana, Jamaica, and Mexico. Jordan, Bangladesh, and the Philippines did ask the question and used it to create the category with value -1 and used this value in calculating means. Apart from this major difference, a few countries had special variations in variable construction. Colombia asked about the last birth, but gave this group the code '7' and excluded it completely in calculating the mean number of additional children wanted, although it was included in tables showing the percent distribution. Fiji did not ask questions about how many or how many more children respondents wanted, but if the woman said that she wanted more, the number of additional children wanted was estimated by subtracting the number of living children from the total desired family size, while those who did not want more, or who were sterilized were given the value '0'. The Philippines gave the Undecided group the value '0', and included them in calculating means, instead of applying the recommendation that they be excluded for this purpose.

In the case of Bangladesh this variable is not comparable with other countries because the basic question 'Do you want another (any) child (children)?' was modified to be 'Do you want another (any) child (children) soon?', as it was felt that the time reference in the Core question was too vague to obtain any meaningful answers.

Total Number of Children Desired: Three countries did not ask exactly as recommended the question: 'If you could choose exactly the number of children to have in your whole life, how many children would that be?' Pakistan asked instead, 'In your opinion how many children should a married couple have?', which is closer to the definition of ideal than to desired family size. Malaysia modified the wording of the question only slightly, but the meaning was essentially the same.

Fiji omitted this question completely, but constructed a variable that was used as total number of children desired. The total number of children desired was obtained for different groups of women as follows:

- (a) For currently married fecund women who want more children the source was Q.419 or Q.427 (if the answer was given as a range, the higher figure was taken);
- (b) Currently married fecund women who were undecided about more children were classified as 'not decided' with regard to total family size;
- (c) For currently married fecund women wanting no more children the total desired family size was taken to equal the number of living children, except for women who answered 'no' to Q.405, in which case Q.406 was used as the source;
- (d) For sterilized women, the same procedure as in (c) above was used;
- (e) Widowed, separated or divorced women, and currently

married but infecund women, were classified as 'not asked', unless they answered 'no' to Q.405, in which case Q.406 was used as the source.

Variations in Base Populations: A few countries constructed certain base population groups differently from the recommended format. Fiji, Malaysia, Pakistan, Thailand, and Dominican Republic were the countries with a large number of such deviations. These variations from recommended bases are all footnoted in the relevant tables, but the most important changes are mentioned briefly here.

One major variation was to define the groups currently married 'fecund' and 'exposed' as excluding contraceptively sterilized women, whereas the standard definition includes them for the group of tables on Contraception in Relation to Fertility Preferences. This is true for Thailand, Pakistan, Malaysia, and Dominican Republic, although the Dominican Republic and Thailand did use the standard definition for some tables in the group on Preferences for Numbers and Sex of Children. A second variation is the inclusion of infecund women in some tables where 'exposed' women should be the base population. This holds for the Dominican Republic, Malaysia, Pakistan, and Thailand for some tables in the group on Knowledge and Use of Contraception (usually Tables 4.4.1-4.4.5). In addition, Thailand and Dominican Republic excluded pregnant women from the base population for some tables on Preferences (Thailand Tables 3.3.1-3.3.3 and Dominican Republic Tables 3.3.1-3.3.5), although the title of these tables states that the base is currently married fecund women. Finally, Fiji excluded its specially created group 'Post Partum Abstinence' from the base for some tables on current use of contraception and current use by desire for more children, when these women should have been counted as exposed but not using contraception.

Contraceptive Methods Used: An important variation in the method of questioning about contraceptive knowledge and use occurs in the case of Pakistan. Women were asked the usual questions to obtain spontaneous knowledge of specific methods, and were asked if they had ever used any of these spontaneously mentioned methods. No probing was done for knowledge or use of methods not mentioned, which is a departure from the procedure followed in all other countries. If this approach resulted in an underestimation of knowledge or ever-use, current use levels would also be affected, since only ever-users are asked about current use. Fiji, in contrast, excluded the questions which would obtain spontaneous knowledge, but asked the usual set of probe questions.

In Malaysia, the method douche was not used as a category, and it is unclear whether spontaneous mentions of this method were grouped with Other Female Scientific Methods, and there treated as an efficient method, instead of the normal inclusion among inefficient methods. Similarly, Nepal omitted a few methods, and in the case of Efficient methods, Other Female Scientific methods were absent; other omitted methods were douche, withdrawal, and rhythm.

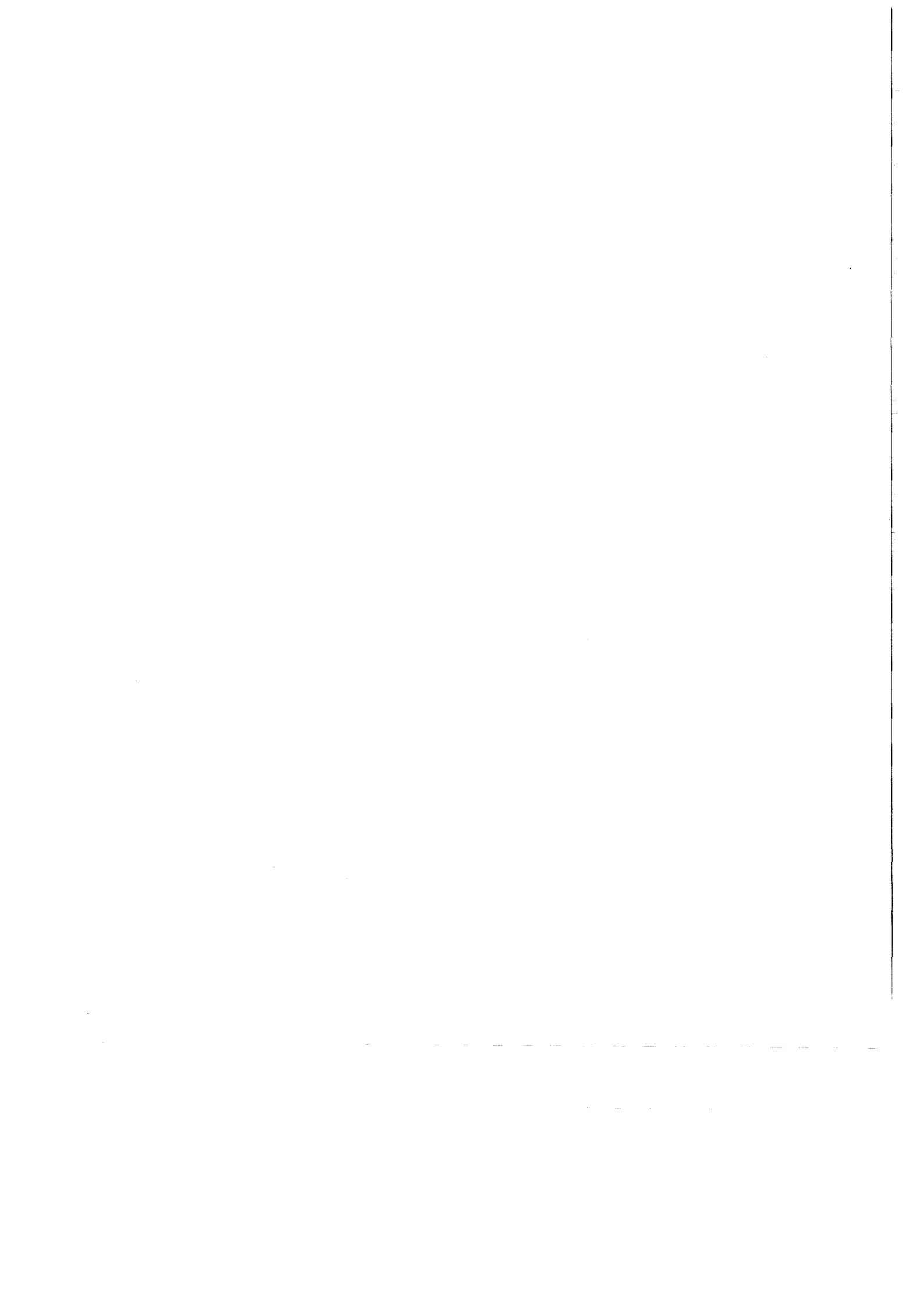
