Editorial note

The present publication is an extension of an earlier cross-national summary by Mohammad Kabir, published in 1980 as *WFS Comparative Studies* no 6. The present work complements the earlier publication.

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Preface

One of the main objectives of the WFS programme was the collection and dissemination of internationally comparable data on human fertility, obtained through nationally representative interview surveys carried out in a large number of countries. Many institutions and research workers at international and national levels are engaged in cross-national comparative analysis of the data collected. The WFS London headquarters also undertook comparative analysis such as cross-national summaries.

The cross-national summaries present basic results from WFS surveys in developing countries on a wide range of topics. These summaries are published in the *WFS Comparative Studies* series.

A first group of cross-national summaries based upon 19 countries for which the First Country Report and standard recode tapes were available early in 1980 has been completed with the publication of seventeen issues (*WFS Comparative Studies* nos 1–15, 17 and 19). A second group, covering 28 developing countries, and including African countries for the first time, has now also been published.

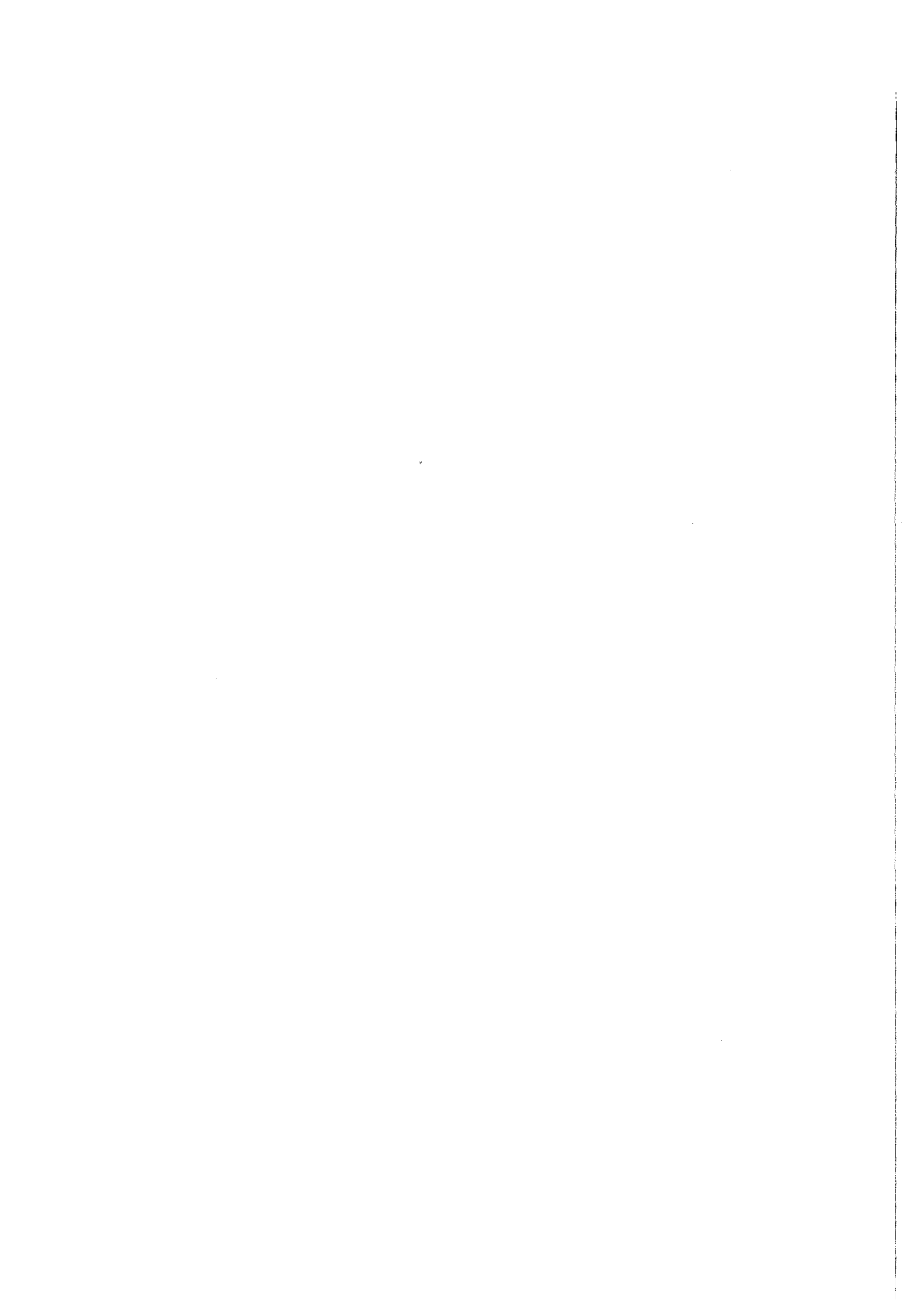
Several of the cross-national summaries are concerned solely with providing detailed and systematized information on the comparability, or lack thereof, of the field procedures, survey characteristics, questionnaire content and wording and content of the First Country Reports (*WFS Comparative Studies* nos 1–5 and 16). Such detailed appraisals constitute an essential reference base for anyone using WFS data for comparative analysis.

Other cross-national summaries present comparable results from as many surveys as possible on a wide range of specific topics. Each summary provides, in addition to tabular material, a brief accompanying text, which draws attention primarily to any non-comparability of the data and to any obvious interpretational pitfalls to which the tables may be subject. Furthermore, although these summaries are not intended to be analytic in their orientation, some brief highlighting of the major noteworthy differences and similarities is included.

The cross-national summaries are intended to assist analysts and policy-makers by providing a ready tool for comparison of data between countries, but at the same time they draw attention to the limits, if any, of such comparability. Some of these two groups of summaries have been updated to cover all developing countries which participated in the WFS programme.

The present report extends an earlier cross-national summary (*WFS Comparative Studies* no 6). Enrique Carrasco and John Cleland are thanked for their valuable comments on an earlier draft.

1 Introduction

Within the framework of the World Fertility Survey (WFS), 41 countries carried out national surveys, comprising both household and individual surveys. This comparative study on the characteristics of household populations draws on the data of 25 surveys, 5 of which were carried out in Africa, 12 in Asia and the Pacific and 8 in Latin America and the Caribbean.

The countries covered here were not specially selected: they were the only countries for which household data were available at the WFS headquarters in London at the time when the tables analysed in this study were constructed (February 1984).

This report updates an earlier work (Kabir 1980). A plan almost identical to the one used by Kabir was therefore adopted, constructing the same type of tables and calculating the same type of indices and measures.

1.1 DATA USED AND THEIR COMPARABILITY

The data used are those collected through the household surveys. These surveys generally had three main objectives:

- 1 to compile a complete list of all persons in the household in order to identify all the women eligible for the individual survey;
- 2 to record a few demographic characteristics for each person listed, such as age, sex and marital status, so as to provide the necessary denominators for the calculation of certain demographic rates;
- 3 to obtain information about the household itself, and contextual variables which may have a direct or indirect bearing on fertility, such as the possession of modern objects, housing conditions, and linguistic or ethnic character.

An extended household schedule was sometimes used, to provide additional data. A number of countries decided to undertake a specially enlarged household survey and to include a few additional questions to make estimates of fertility and mortality levels with greater sampling precision.

As can be seen from table A2, these topics were not uniformly covered by the household questionnaires of the countries included in this study. Questions on age and sex were asked in all countries, but questions on other socio-demographic characteristics were not always asked. In Trinidad and Tobago, for example, no question was asked on marital status. The minimum age of respondents who were asked about marital status varied

considerably from country to country, ranging from 8 in Bangladesh to 15 years. In a number of countries – Cameroon, Malaysia and Haiti – no lower age limit was fixed.

The question on ethnic identity was asked only in four countries: Cameroon, Fiji, Ivory Coast and Malaysia, and partially in Sudan. Clearly, the concept of ethnic group was interpreted differently in different countries. The criteria used to classify groups were diverse: socio-linguistic group, race, nationality, country of origin, tribe (in Sudan) were all used in different countries.

Fifteen countries included questions on fertility. Here again, the number and nature of the questions asked, as well as the category of women questioned, varied from country to country. Of the 15 countries, 12 included all the questions from the fertility module of the household schedule. These questions covered the total number of children ever born, their sex, survival status and whether they were living with their mother at the time of the survey. The module also included questions relating to the last live birth: date, sex and survival status. Two countries included fertility-related questions on births occurring either in the course of one year (1977 in the Philippines) or over a period (the last 12 months in Mexico). The category of women who were interviewed with the fertility module of the household schedule was defined either by age, marital status (all women or ever-married women), eligibility for the individual survey (Panama, Peru), or a combination of these criteria. Finally, the following countries did not include any questions on fertility: Ivory Coast, Bangladesh, Nepal, Pakistan, Sri Lanka, Indonesia, Malaysia, Thailand, Trinidad and Tobago and Haiti (for further details, see Singh 1984).

Of the countries studied here, 17 included questions on education. However, Ivory Coast, Mauritania, Nepal, Sri Lanka, Fiji, Indonesia, Thailand, Mexico and Trinidad and Tobago collected no information on education or the educational attainment of household members.

Six countries fixed no age limits for the questions on education. In most countries, however, an age limit of 6 years or above (five countries) or 7 (four countries) was applied. In Colombia the minimum age limit was set at 5 years.

1.2 CHARACTERISTICS STUDIED AND INDICES CALCULATED

This report examines only some of the demographic characteristics of household populations, the most important and most comparable, and does not analyse all the information collected in the household surveys. The characteristics described refer to the population

(tables A3–A22), or the household (tables A23–A27), or the head of household (tables A28–A29).

The population was studied according to its distribution by age, sex, marital status, level of education and place of residence. A number of summary indices were calculated and are reviewed: Myers' and Whipple's indices and the index of attraction of round numbers; the

child–woman ratio; the dependency ratio; mean and median ages at first marriage; Coale's index (I_m).

The second series of tables deals with the household as a statistical unit and covers mainly the size, structure and composition of the households interviewed.

Finally, the distribution of the heads of household is examined according to age, sex and marital status.

2 Distribution of Household Population According to Age and Sex

2.1 AGE-SEX STRUCTURE

The structure of a population by sex and age, at any given moment, is the result of past history and in turn causes the future development of the population, not only at the demographic level but also at the economic and social levels. In most societies, social roles are closely associated with sex and age and any change in the composition of a population by age and sex clearly has repercussions on all social institutions, constituting an important factor in social change. The study of the age-sex structure in developing countries, however, is frustrated by widespread ignorance of age in these countries. Ignorance affects accuracy of age reporting, and the level of ignorance is revealed by the indices calculated, thus limiting the use of age information. Demographers have a number of tools which may be used to uncover errors, measure their extent and correct them, or at least suggest the type of adjustment needed for the data being processed.

Tables A3, A4 and A5 give the distribution of population by age group and sex for each country, on a nationwide basis and broken down by urban and rural areas. Table A6 gives some summary indices of the age structure of the household populations: the proportion of children aged under 15, the proportion of adults aged 15-64, the proportion of women of childbearing age in the female population, the child-woman ratio and the dependency ratio.

The figures in tables A3, A4 and A5 suffer from some reporting errors, although on the whole errors decrease from one age group to the next. The very low proportion of children aged less than one in Bangladesh probably reflects underenumeration of this section of the population. However, the low proportions in the same age groups in Sri Lanka and Fiji are probably explained by fertility decline, which would have caused the base of the population age pyramid to begin to shrink.

This assumption is confirmed by an examination of the percentage of the population in other age groups. In the majority of the countries studied, the 0-4 age group predominates, but in Malaysia, Philippines, Colombia and Panama, the 5-9 age group is the largest. And in Sri Lanka, Fiji, Costa Rica and Trinidad and Tobago - all countries where fertility is relatively low, with a total fertility rate below 4 children - the modal age group is the 10-14 group.

2.2 SOME SUMMARY INDICES

A population is conventionally divided into three broad age groups: children (those under 15), adults (those aged 15-64) and the elderly (those aged 65 and over). This

classification has the advantage of enabling the age structure of the population to be succinctly described.

Table A6 shows that in all the countries studied, the population aged under 15 accounts for more than 36 per cent of the total population. This finding confirms the extreme youth of the populations of the countries in question and bears out what is known from other sources about the age structure of developing countries. The highest proportions of children are found in Jordan (53.1 per cent), Syria (48.6 per cent) and Mauritania (47.7 per cent), and the lowest in Haiti (39.3 per cent), Sri Lanka (38.1 per cent) and Trinidad and Tobago (36.3 per cent).

In general, the proportion of children in the countries studied follows the same trend as the general fertility levels, being higher where fertility is high and lower where fertility is moderately low or in decline.

The ratio between the population regarded as dependent, that is children under 15 and adults over 64, and the population aged 15-64 is known as the dependency ratio. This ratio expresses the mean number of people who may be considered not economically active per economically active person, and therefore serves as an indicator of the economic and social impact of the age structure of the population.

Table A6 shows that at the national level the highest dependency ratios were observed, in descending order, in Jordan, Syria, Mauritania, Bangladesh, Mexico and Sudan. In these countries, each person in the productive age group supports more than one person in the dependent age groups.

At the other extreme, Trinidad and Tobago, Sri Lanka, Haiti and Indonesia have the lowest dependency ratios, with 71, 74 and 79 dependents, respectively, per 100 productive persons. These figures, although relatively low, are still not comparable to the dependency ratios generally observed in developed countries. Because of their low fertility and the small proportion of children in their populations, developed countries have dependency ratios around 55 per 100 economically active persons: Australia (1976): 56; USA (1976): 54; England (1975): 59; Japan (1976): 48; and Belgium (1975): 56.

Another summary measure calculated and included in table A6 is the child-woman ratio, which measures the number of children under 5 years old per thousand women in the reproductive age group (15-49). In countries where registration of births is non-existent or incomplete, this index often serves as a measure of the fertility level. This index must be used with caution, since its numerator is the number of children born during the last five years and surviving at the time of the survey. It thus depends not only on the level of fertility but also on the level of infant and child mortality prevailing in that period. This index could also be affected by

under-reporting of the population aged under 5, as discussed below in section 2.5.

The classification of countries according to the value of their child-woman ratio is similar to the classification by dependency ratio: Jordan, Ivory Coast, Syria, Mauritania and Cameroon are at the top of the list with 924, 851, 832, 777 and 769 children, respectively, per thousand women of reproductive age.

Conversely, Trinidad and Tobago, Sri Lanka and Costa Rica have much lower child-woman ratios (of around 500), which are close to those generally observed in developed countries.

2.3 SEX RATIOS

The sex ratio, the number of males per 100 females, enables the numbers of each sex at all ages or at a given age to be compared (figure 1). The distribution by sex of the total populations of the African countries studied shows an imbalance in favour of women, with a sex ratio below 100. The male deficit is particularly marked in Mauritania, which has the lowest sex ratio (91.8), and Cameroon (94).

In Asia and the Pacific, and most notably in Jordan, Sri Lanka and the Philippines, male and female numbers are more or less evenly balanced. However, in Syria, Bangladesh, Pakistan and Fiji, there is a preponderance of males. In Latin America and the Caribbean, with the exception of Panama and Trinidad and Tobago, females outnumber males.

When they are analysed by age group, sex ratios show major divergences. The sex ratio at age 0 (less than one year) is on the whole satisfactory, with values close to the theoretical sex ratio at birth (105 boys to 100 girls). There are, however, some exceptions, with the sex ratio at this age in some countries being either abnormally low or abnormally high. An abnormally low ratio was recorded in Cameroon (98), Sri Lanka (92) and Haiti (99), while an abnormally high ratio, which is more unusual, was observed in Fiji (114), Peru (112), Trinidad and Tobago (117) and, particularly, Costa Rica (124). Further, there is not always a steady decline in sex ratios as age increases. The pattern familiar in Western societies of the sex ratio falling from nearly 105 at birth to nearly 30 at 100 years because of higher male mortality (Pressat 1979) is not observed here. On the contrary, in most of the countries studied, an increase in the sex ratios at relatively advanced ages was noted. In fact, in half the countries, over the age of 65 there were more men alive than women.

The age-sex distribution of the populations is broadly characterized by a numerical predominance of males at early ages (under 15) and advanced ages (60 and over or 65 and over, according to the country), and a predominance of females or a balance between the sexes in the adult age groups (15-64). Some countries, however, are an exception: in Mauritania the sex ratio from 15 upwards is constantly below 100, and in Korea the same is true from 20 upwards, with a peak at 30-39.

The lowest sex ratios are observed in adult age groups, between 20 and 39 in most of the countries studied, and the highest at advanced ages.

In conclusion, the age-sex structure has been influenced, jointly or separately, by an under-enumeration of girls of under one year or excess mortality of girl babies, understatement of age of adult and old women and overstatement of age of men as well as differential mortality for the two sexes. It is difficult to distinguish with certainty the truth from the distortions caused by errors of reporting or enumeration.

2.4 AGE-SEX STRUCTURES ACCORDING TO TYPE OF PLACE OF RESIDENCE

In this section, the differences in age and sex composition between the urban and rural sections of the population are examined.

It should be noted at the start that the definitions of urban and rural were not standardized or redefined in such a way as to make comparisons possible. The definitions used here are those adopted by those responsible for the surveys at the national level. They are based on a variety of criteria, socio-economic, administrative or population size (Singh 1980), and refer almost exclusively to the concept of 'urban', 'rural' being simply defined negatively as 'what is not urban'.

The data in table A6 show that the proportion of young people aged under 15 is higher in rural than in urban areas, varying between 38 per cent (Sri Lanka) and 57 per cent (Jordan) in rural areas, and between 34 per cent (Trinidad and Tobago) and 51 per cent (Jordan) in urban areas.

On the other hand, the highest proportions of women of childbearing age and of adults of working age are found in urban areas. The proportion of adults in the urban population is everywhere higher than 45 per cent, and in Haiti is as high as 62 per cent. The highest proportion of adults in rural areas was observed in Sri Lanka (57 per cent) and the lowest in Jordan (39 per cent). This may be explained by the attraction of urban areas for the rural adult population, mainly because of their employment opportunities. Dependency ratios are much higher in rural areas than in urban areas, exceeding even 100 per cent in ten countries. The most striking values were recorded in Jordan (154 per cent), Syria (120 per cent) and Mauritania (116 per cent). Major differences between the dependency ratios in rural and urban areas were found in Costa Rica, Panama, Haiti, Korea, Thailand, Dominican Republic, Colombia and Sudan. Substantial urban-rural differences were also found in the child-woman ratios, reflecting the differences in fertility levels between these two areas.

Higher fertility in rural areas has led to a lower child-woman ratio in urban areas in all the countries except Bangladesh. Of the countries covered, those in Latin America have a clear and marked urban-rural contrast. Thus in Haiti, the child-woman ratio in rural areas is nearly double that in urban areas, and it is 84 per cent higher in Colombia, 72 per cent higher in Dominican Republic, 65 per cent higher in Panama and 58 per cent higher in Costa Rica.

Outside Latin America, rural-urban differences of this magnitude in child-woman ratios were found in Morocco (770 as against 490) and Thailand (610 as

against 383). The two indices are closest in Mauritania, Cameroon, Pakistan and Bangladesh.

Analysis of sex ratios according to age group and type of place of residence, as seen in tables A4 and A5, show up the differences in sex composition between the urban and rural populations. In all African countries except Morocco, males are numerically superior in urban areas and in the minority in rural areas. The opposite pattern is observed in the Latin American countries, with male predominance in rural areas and female predominance in towns.

These findings bear out what is already known about rural-urban migration patterns in the two continents. In Latin America, men are responsible for most agricultural activities, whereas the reverse is true of Africa. Rural-urban migration usually affects the section of the population which is least involved in agriculture, and thus it is women in Latin America and men in Africa who usually migrate to the towns.

The sex ratios at adult ages according to type of place of residence confirm this hypothesis. In Latin America, sex ratios over 15 years show a predominance of males in rural areas and of females in urban areas. In Africa, again, the reverse is true.

The Asian and Pacific group of countries do not all fall into one single category, but overall the situation is closer to that of Africa than Latin America.

Some Asian countries – Syria, Bangladesh, Pakistan and Sri Lanka – show male predominance in both urban and rural areas. Nevertheless, even in these cases the sex ratios are higher in urban areas.

2.5 QUALITY OF AGE REPORTING

The comments which have been made and the conclusions on age-sex composition which have been drawn are only valid in so far as the information collected is accurate. While it is fair to assume that errors in the reporting of sex are negligible, the same is clearly not true of age reporting. This section evaluates the quality of age reporting, using well-known indices, especially Myers' index (figure 2) and Whipple's index. An assessment of accuracy of age reporting is particularly necessary since age has been used here as a basic background variable, and comparisons are made between countries whose data may be of different quality.

Table A7 gives Myers' index calculated for the age group 10–69. In order to obtain the various Myers' indices, the enumerated population must be rearranged into a fictitious population in which, in the absence of any preference or aversion for certain digits, 10 per cent would normally have an age ending with 0, 10 per cent with 1, 10 per cent with 2, and so on. A percentage of more than 10 indicates a preference for the digit in question. The deviations (in absolute values) from 10 per cent for each digit are then added and their sum constitutes Myers' summary index (United Nations 1955). Theoretically, then, Myers' summary index varies from 0 to 180. The lower its value, the less the preference for a particular digit. Some authors prefer to use half the sum of the absolute deviations from 10 per cent as Myers' index, and in this case the spread of the index is from 0

to 90 (Shryock *et al* 1973). This method was used to calculate the Myers' indices shown in table A7.

Table A7 shows that in almost all the countries studied heaping occurs at ages ending in 0 and 5. This tendency is particularly strong in the African countries and also in the Asian countries, with the exception of Korea, the Philippines, Thailand, Fiji and Malaysia. In Latin America, the tendency is on the whole weak, except in Haiti and the Dominican Republic.

The highest Myers' index values were recorded in Sudan, Pakistan, Mauritania, Jordan, Nepal, Cameroon and Indonesia. The best quality of age reporting was observed in Korea, Philippines, Thailand, Fiji, Malaysia, Syria and in almost all Latin American countries.

In Africa, Myers' summary index is lower for men, reflecting better age reporting. In Latin America, on the other hand, the index value is lower for women. In Asia, the situation is mixed: in Bangladesh, Nepal, Pakistan, Korea, Thailand and Indonesia, Myers' summary index is higher for men than for women. In the remaining countries in the Asian and Pacific group, the opposite is true.

For all the countries studied, Myers' summary index varies from 1.8 (Philippines) to 27.2 (Pakistan) for males and from 1.7 (Korea) to 26.8 (Sudan) for females.

Table A8 gives two other series of indices which measure heaping at ages ending in 0 or 5. The first series was calculated for all ages between 3 and 67 which are multiples of 5. For each age x , the index was calculated by dividing the enumerated population of age x by one-fifth of the population of ages $(x - 2)$, $(x - 1)$, x , $(x + 1)$ and $(x + 2)$. For example, the index for 5 years is the result of dividing the enumerated population of age 5 by one-fifth of the population of ages 3, 4, 5, 6 and 7 years. This method thus compares a measured number (numerator) with an estimated number (denominator), assuming an arithmetic progression of the population from one age to the next.

Here again, the preference for digits 0 and, to a slightly lesser degree, 5, becomes stronger as age increases. Only Korea, Thailand and Trinidad and Tobago seem to be exceptions to this rule. This preference for round numbers is weaker in the Latin American and Caribbean countries than in countries in other continents.

In most countries, the attraction of round figures is particularly strong from age 50 onwards.

The three last columns of table A8 give Whipple's index for each country according to sex and type of place of residence. The index also measures preference for the digits 0 and 5. It is obtained by first adding the population reported in each single year of age between 23 and 62 inclusive. The second step is to obtain the sum of all persons within the same age range reported at ages which are multiples of five (25, 30, etc) and to divide it by one-fifth of the sum obtained in the first step. The result, multiplied by 100, forms Whipple's index and should range between 100 and 500.

The values of this index are close to 100 only in Korea, Thailand, Trinidad and Tobago and Philippines, indicating an absence or near absence of preference for the digits 0 and 5.

Jordan, Pakistan, Nepal, Bangladesh, Indonesia and all the African countries have a high Whipple's index,

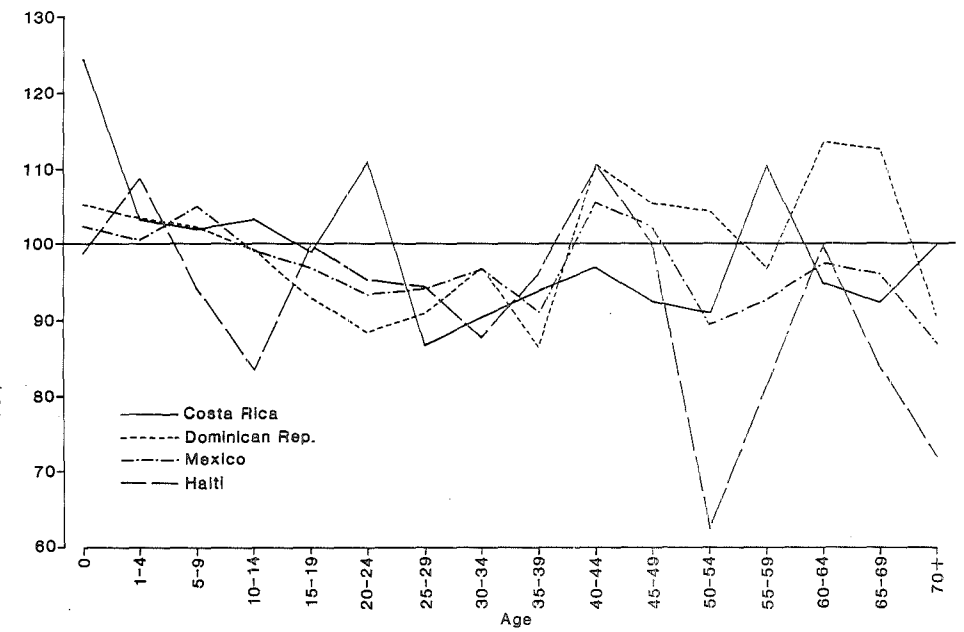
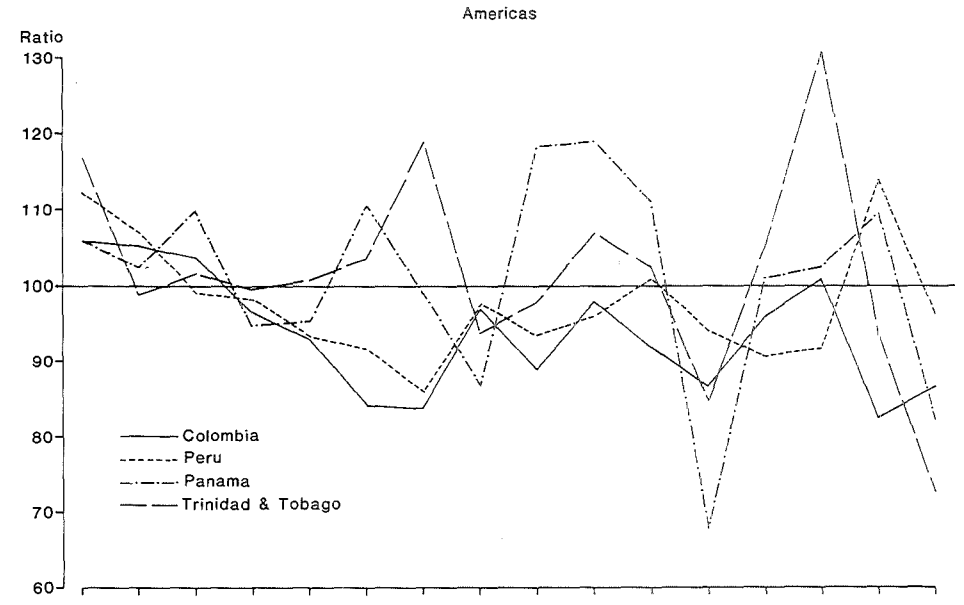
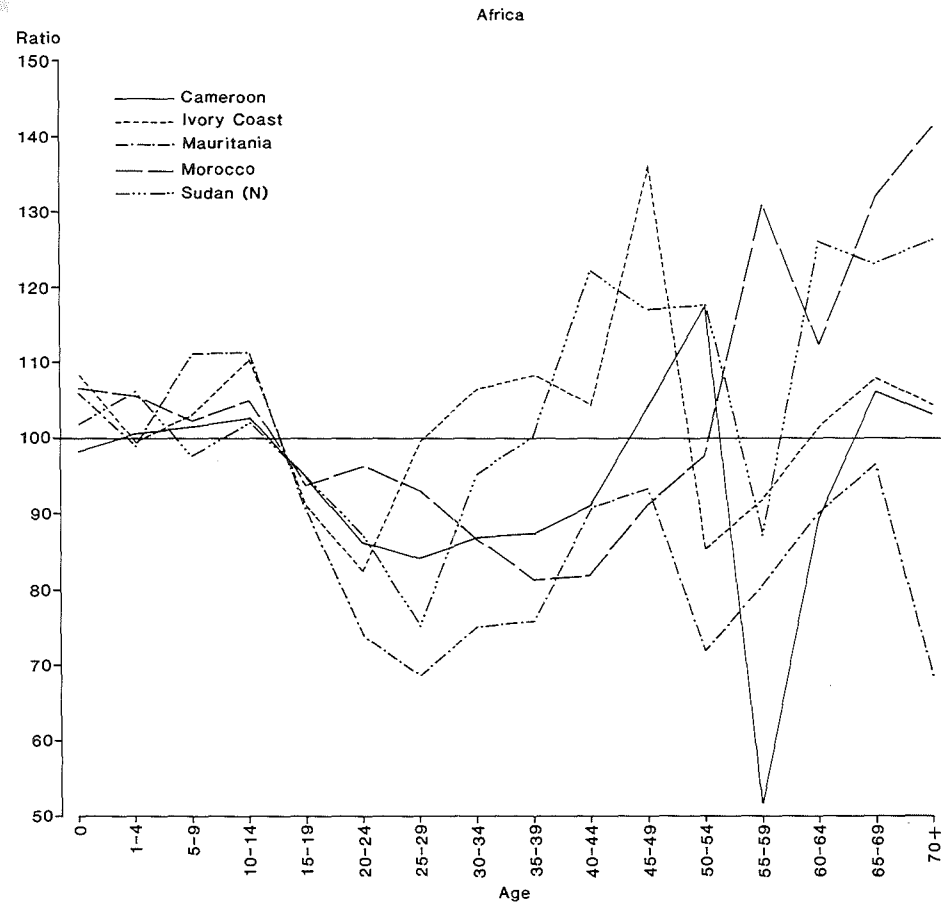
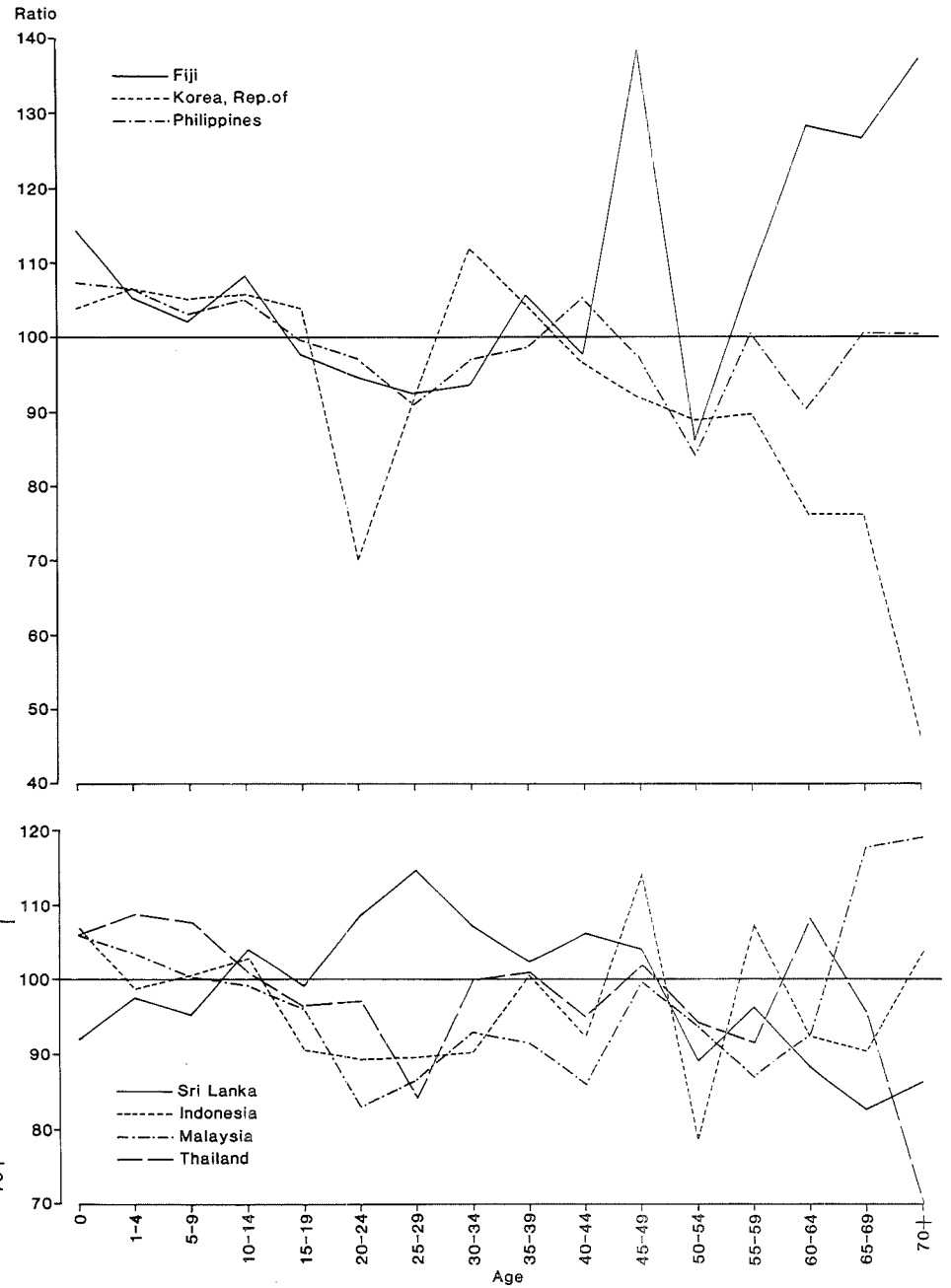
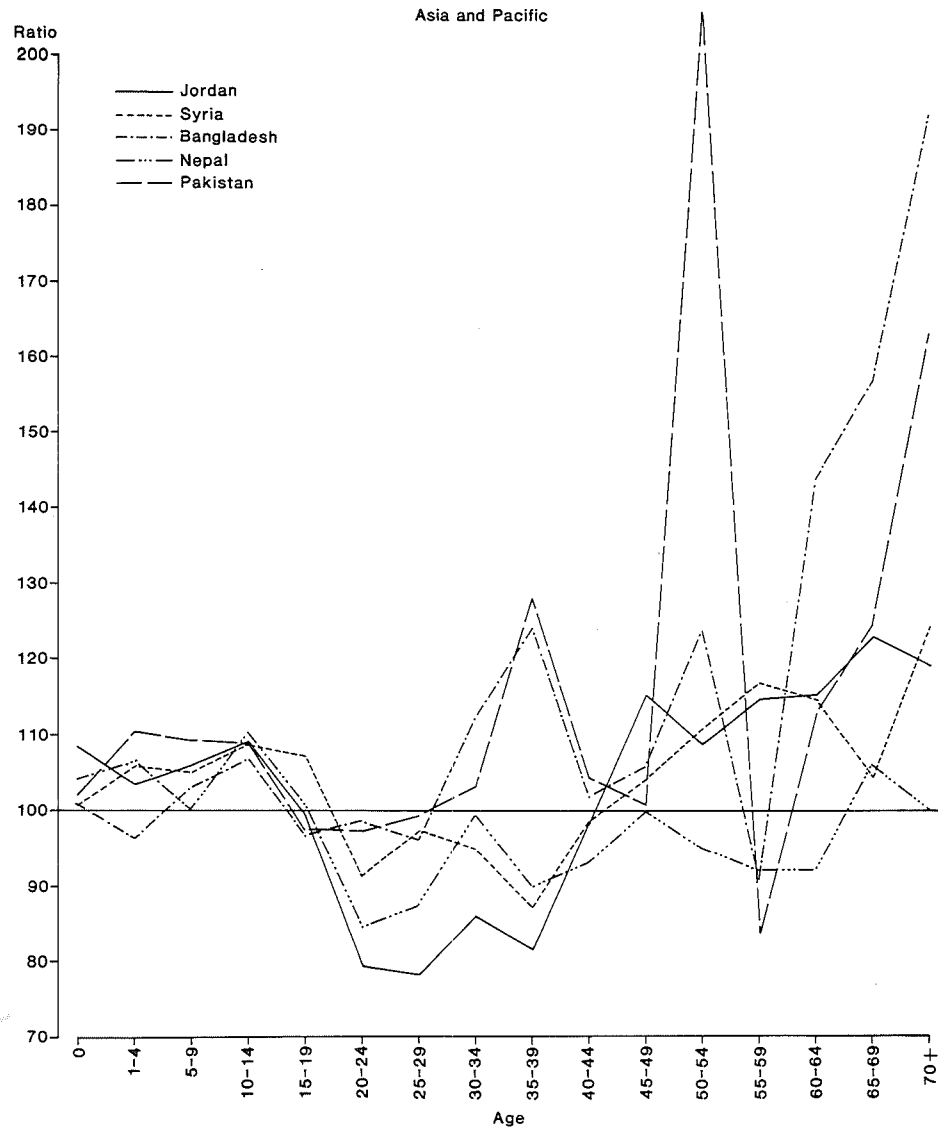


Figure 1 Sex ratio – total population



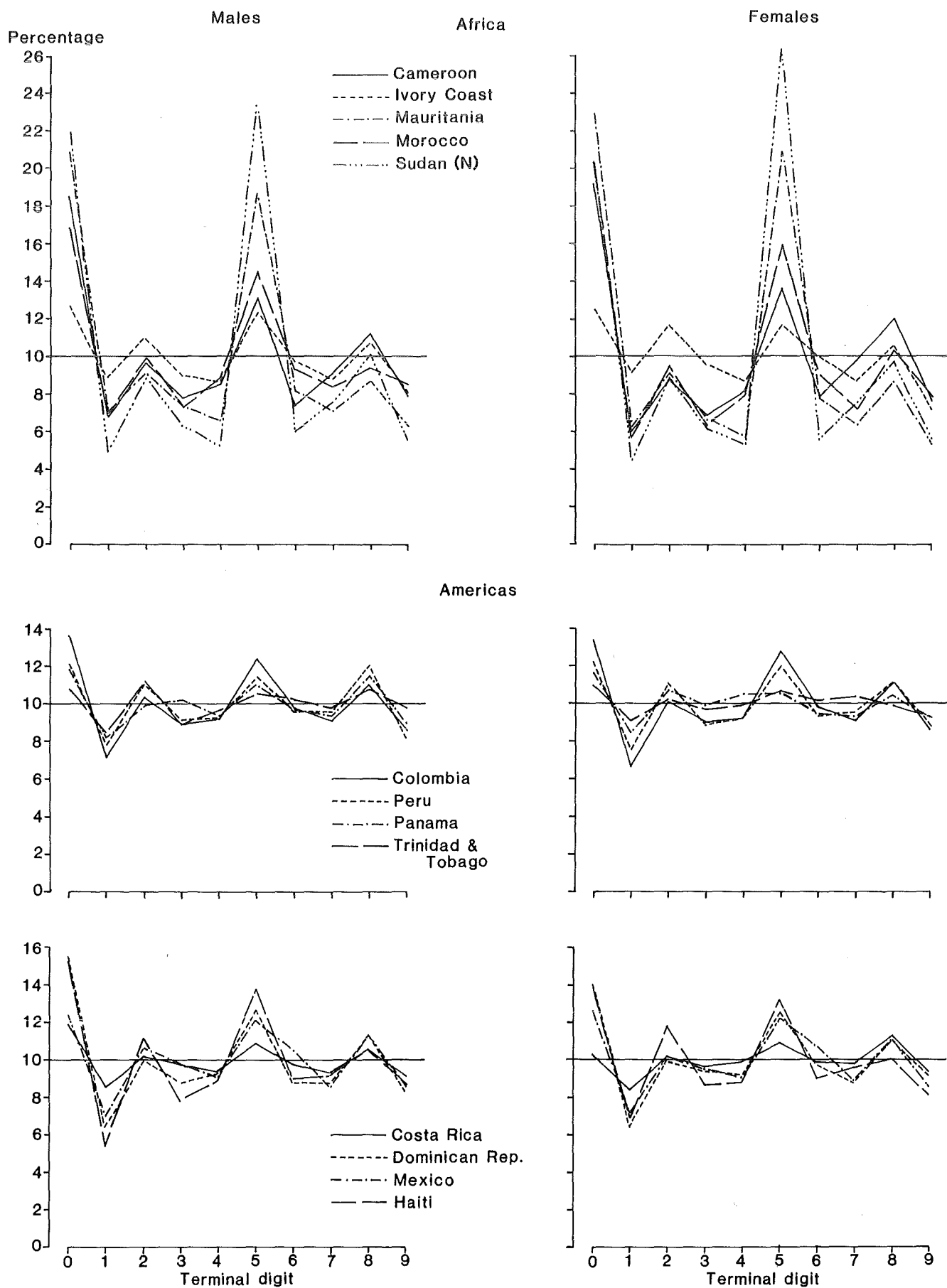


Figure 2 Per cent distribution of population according to terminal digit of reported age from Myers' blended index

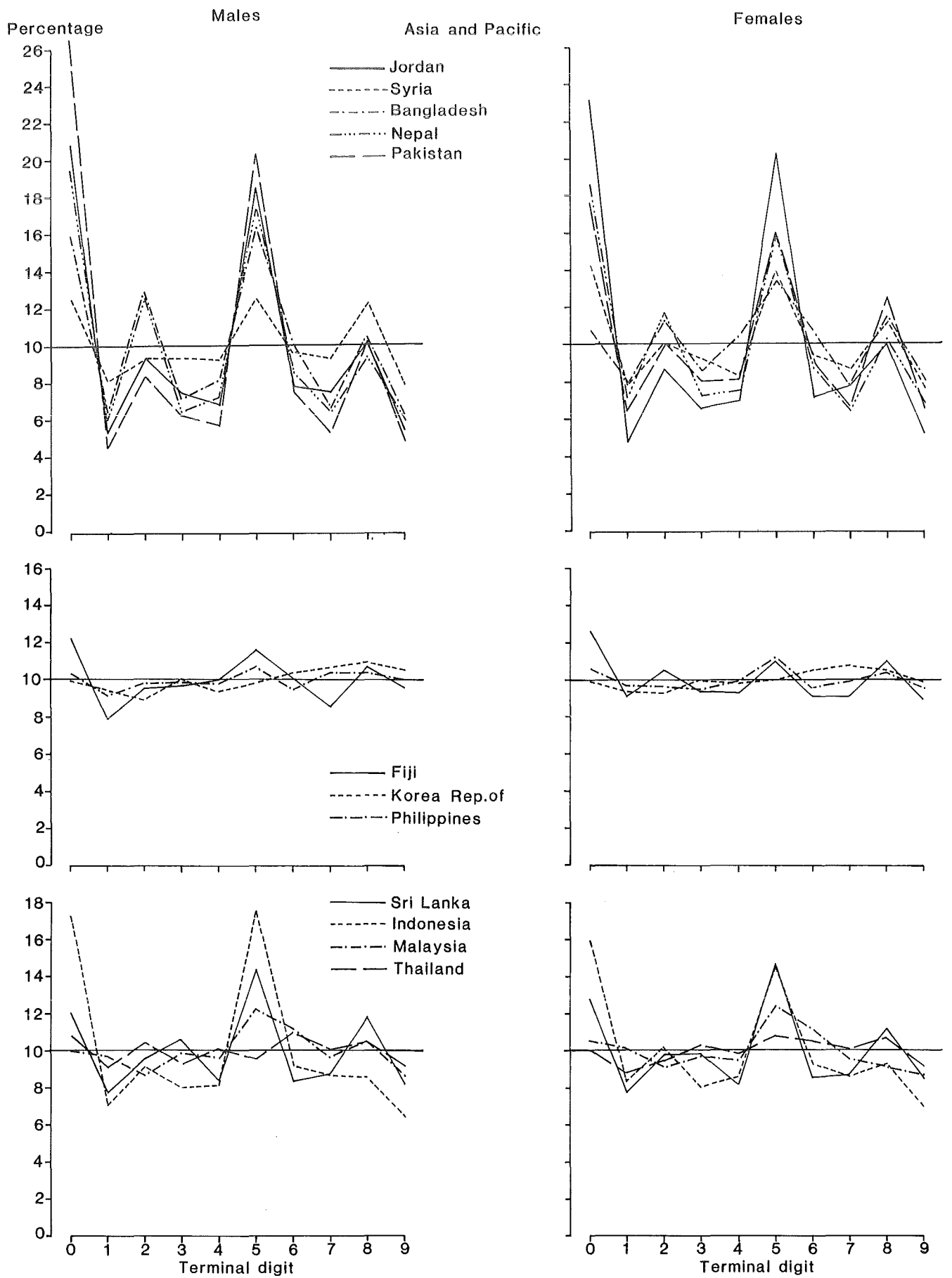


Figure 2 (cont)

approaching and in some cases exceeding 200. The highest index was recorded for Sudan, where it was 279 for men and 286 for women.

An examination of Myers' and Whipple's indices according to type of place of residence shows that, for a

given country and sex, the index obtained for rural areas is always higher than that for urban areas. There are, however, a few exceptions: Bangladesh, Nepal, Korea, Thailand and Costa Rica for Myers' index, and Bangladesh and Fiji for Whipple's index.

3 Some Nuptiality Patterns

Marriage may be legal, customary or consensual. The very fact of taking national or local laws and customs into consideration in defining marriage shows how essentially cultural it is. It would be impossible to find a universal definition, since human societies are so diverse.

As one of the aims of the World Fertility Survey was to collect internationally comparable data, attempts were made by those responsible for the national surveys to use definitions of marital status which were internationally or at least regionally comparable. The categories used are broad and embrace the diversity of the union types observed, particularly in Africa, Latin America and the Caribbean. In these last regions, marital status was defined as any kind of more or less durable consensual union, and included, of course, legal marriage. This has the advantage of including all forms of socially recognized union, regardless of their legal status: legal marriage, religious marriage or customary marriage. In the Caribbean, the definition was explicitly extended to include non-cohabiting (ie visiting) unions.

With these definitions, it was possible to classify the household populations according to sex, age and marital status. Four categories were used for this last variable: never married (those who had never been in union), currently married, widowed, and divorced or separated.

This chapter takes this classification as a starting point to examine three aspects of nuptiality: its intensity according to age, its tempo, and the frequency of union dissolution.

3.1 INTENSITY OF NUPTIALITY

Intensity of nuptiality is usually measured by the proportion of persons in a cohort who contract at least one marriage by the age of 50.

The proportion of those never married at age 50 is often used as an indicator of the frequency of permanent celibacy. The values of this index in the countries studied are shown in table 1. This table shows that marriage is almost universal, particularly in Africa and Asia, where nearly 98 per cent of women marry sooner or later. In the Philippines and Thailand and in the Latin American countries, marriage is less universal, with the intensity of nuptiality varying between 90 and 95 per cent. The highest levels of celibacy were found in Colombia and Costa Rica. This near universality of marriage in the countries covered seems to be the only characteristic really common to all these countries.

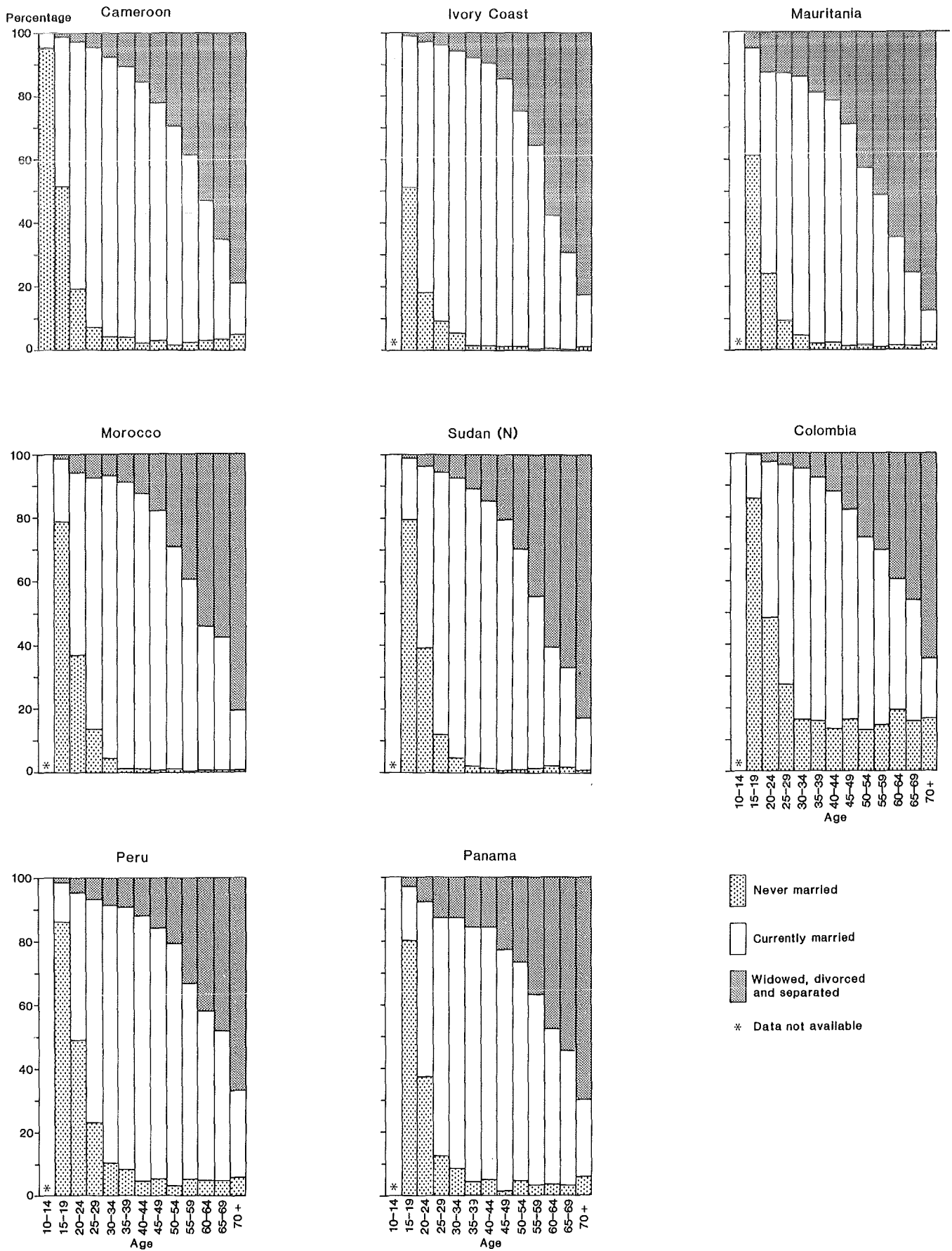
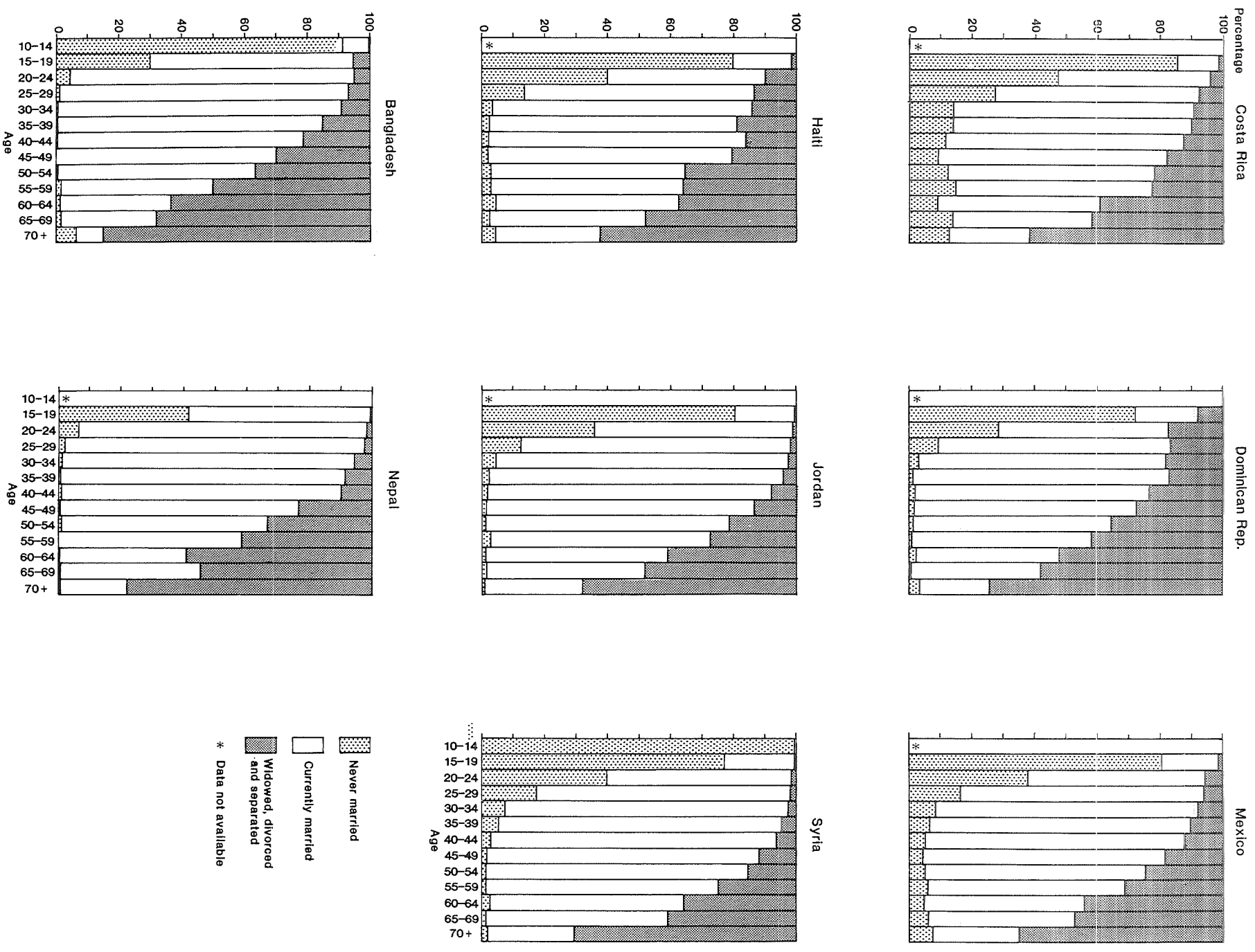


Figure 3 Per cent distribution of ever married women according to marital status by age group

The composition by age and marital status of the female population, as shown in tables A9, A11, A13 and A15, demonstrates widely varying patterns of nuptiality (see also figure 3). At 15-19 years, for instance, the proportion of women still single is only 30 per cent in

Bangladesh, 42 per cent in Nepal, 52 per cent in Cameroon, 61 per cent in Pakistan and Mauritania; but it is as high as 99 per cent in Sri Lanka and Korea, and 93 per cent in the Philippines. In Latin America, the proportion of women unmarried in this age group varies between 73 and 86 per cent.

The proportion of women ever married between 15 and 49 years varies considerably from continent to continent, and, within continents, from country to country: between 70 and 83 per cent in Africa, and between 72 per cent (Dominican Republic) and 58 per cent (Colombia) in Latin America. Asia is as heterogeneous as Latin America: 72 per cent of women in the reproductive age range were ever married in Jordan and Bangladesh, as against only 57 per cent in the Philippines and 59 per cent in Sri Lanka and Fiji.

The intensity of nuptiality is also high among men. There is indeed only a slight difference between the intensity of male and female nuptiality and there is a positive correlation between these two indices.

Marriage is also almost universal among men. In 19 countries, the proportion of men never married at age 50 is equal or inferior to 5 per cent; the highest proportion of men who never marry is found in the Latin American countries.

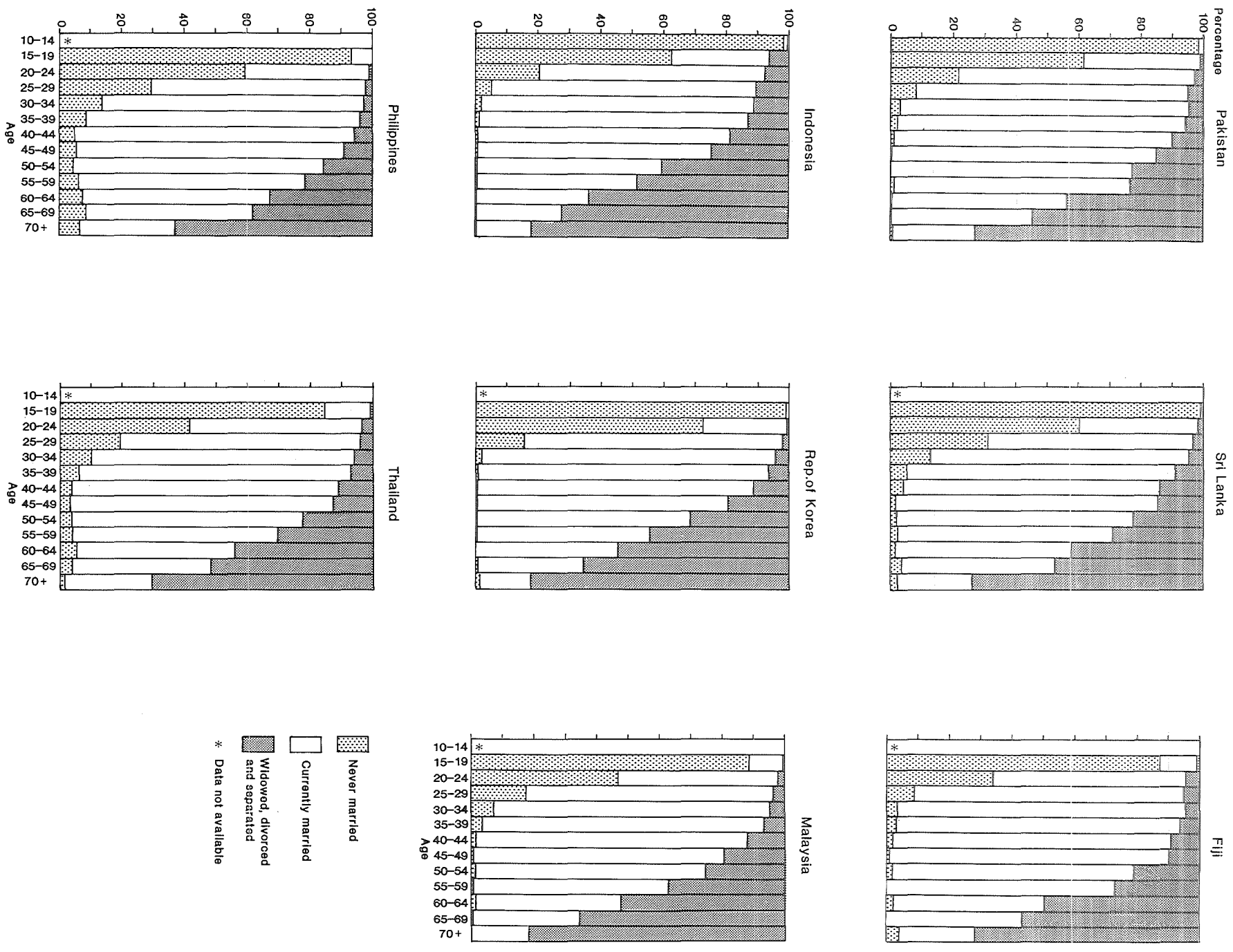


Figure 3 (cont)

3.2 TEMPO OF NUPTIALITY

The tempo of nuptiality is shown by the distribution of marriages within a cohort according to age at first marriage. It could be summarized by the mean age and sometimes by the median age at first marriage.

In the absence of data by cohort, the mean age at first marriage was estimated by Hajnal's method (singulate mean age at marriage or SMAM) from the distribution of the population according to age, marital status and sex. The results are shown in table A15. The figures indicate a relative homogeneity in Africa and Latin America and wide variations in the mean age at first marriage of women in Asia.

In Africa, mean age varies between 18.6 (Cameroon) and 21.8 years (Sudan) and in Latin America between 20.5 (Dominican Republic) and 23.2 years (Peru). Both the earliest and latest marriages were observed in Asia. In Bangladesh and Nepal, mean age at first marriage is 16 and 17 respectively, and in Sri Lanka and the Philippines, 25 and 24.5.

Similar patterns were observed for the tempo of nuptiality among men: greater homogeneity in age at first marriage in Latin America and Africa and greater heterogeneity in Asia. Table A15 shows that men marry on average between 26 and 28 in Africa and between 24 and 27 in Latin America. In Asia, the lowest mean and median ages at marriage were recorded in Nepal, and the highest in Sri Lanka and Korea.

It is interesting to note in conclusion that a comparison between the mean age at marriage for females and males shows the persistence of the traditional model of nuptiality, which remains predominant in most of the countries studied, except for a few in Latin America. This model is characterized by a high intensity of marriage, relatively early timing and an age difference, often considerable, between husband and wife. This is illustrated by the case of Bangladesh, where the marriage of girls is often arranged at a very young age, and where 99 per cent of men and women marry sooner or later. Women in Bangladesh marry at a mean age of 16, and marry men on average eight years older than them.

3.3 DISSOLUTION OF UNIONS

In the absence of detailed marriage histories, the proportion of the population who are widowed, divorced and separated may serve as a rough indicator of the level of the dissolution of unions.

Analysis of the distribution of the female population according to marital status shows that divorce occurs relatively early in some countries, particularly in Mauritania, Bangladesh, Indonesia and Dominican Republic.

According to figures in table A9, 5 per cent of the total female population aged 15–19 are divorced in the first three countries and 8 per cent in the last. Of the ever-married female population in this age cohort, as many as 12 per cent are divorced in Mauritania, 7 per cent in Bangladesh, 14 per cent in Indonesia and 28 per cent in the Dominican Republic.

By 45–49 years, around one ever-married woman in five in Africa is widowed, divorced or separated. Mauri-

tania is an exception, with the proportion as high as 30 per cent. Most of the women not in union among those who are ever married are in fact widows.

In Asia, unions seem to be slightly more stable. With the exception of Thailand and Indonesia, divorce is less frequent than in Africa and Latin America, and widowhood is the main reason for the dissolution of unions. The lowest proportion of Asian women aged 45–49 not in union among all ever married women was found in Fiji (10 per cent) and the highest in Bangladesh (29 per cent) and Indonesia (25 per cent).

In the Latin American countries, the situation is somewhat different. In these countries – mainly in Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, Panama and Haiti – divorce is the main cause of marriage dissolution and divorced and separated women account for the largest number of women not in union among ever-married women aged 45–49.

From the age of 45 years upwards, aided by the age difference between spouses and higher male mortality, the proportion of widows rises rapidly and the proportion of women still married falls. The proportion of divorced women remains stable, differing little from its level at 45–49 years.

Special mention should be made of Mauritania, Sudan and the Latin American countries, notably the Dominican Republic and Panama, in which the percentage of divorced women remains high, even at advanced ages. At 60–64 years, for instance, the percentage of divorced women among ever-married women not currently in union is 22 per cent in Mauritania, 19 per cent in Sudan, and 45 per cent in the Dominican Republic and Panama, as against zero per cent in Bangladesh, 1 per cent in Nepal and 1.6 per cent in Fiji.

Analysis of the distribution of the male population according to marital status, presented in table A10, shows that, *a priori*, fewer men are widowed, divorced or separated than women. From age 25–29 to the oldest age groups, the vast majority of men are currently married. The proportion of widowers only becomes sizeable (around 20 per cent) after the age of 65. With the exception of the Dominican Republic and Panama, the proportion of divorced men hardly exceeds 5 per cent.

The low proportion of men who are divorced and widowed may be explained by the high frequency of remarriage. Widowhood, divorce and separation seem to be more transitory and provisional for men than for women.

Finally, it should be recalled that the distribution of the population according to marital status does not usually give a very clear idea of the frequency of divorce and widowhood, since both may be camouflaged by remarriage.

3.4 URBAN–RURAL DIFFERENCES IN NUPTIALITY

The intensity of nuptiality appears to be linked to type of place of residence (urban–rural) only in the Latin American countries, Thailand and the Philippines.

In these countries the proportion of both women and men who never marry is slightly higher in urban than in

rural areas. In the other countries the differences, where they exist, are negligible.

The data presented in tables A11, A12, A13, A14 and A15 show that the real differences between rural and urban areas lie in the timing of nuptiality and confirm the conclusions reached by McCarthy (1982).

The analysis of the proportion ever married at 15-19 points to earlier marriages in rural areas, a finding valid for all the countries studied with the exception of Haiti where the proportion ever married at these ages is 19 per cent in rural areas as against 23 per cent in urban areas. Table 2 shows that the greatest contrasts in early marriages between rural and urban areas were observed in Malaysia, Morocco, Nepal, Thailand, Indonesia, Philippines and Mexico. The proportion ever married at 15-19 years in rural areas is higher than urban areas by 275 per cent in Malaysia, 150 per cent in Morocco, 114 per cent in Nepal, 113 per cent in Thailand, 110 per cent in

Indonesia, and 100 per cent in the Philippines and Mexico.

Analysis of the mean age and median age at first marriage confirms the existence of this differential behaviour both in countries where nuptiality is early and in those where it is relatively late. Mean age at first marriage of women in urban areas is higher than that of women in rural areas by three years in Morocco and Indonesia, by 2.6 years in Thailand, 2.4 years in Malaysia, 2.2 years in Mexico and Panama, and nearly two years in Sudan, Cameroon, Jordan, Philippines and Costa Rica. There are only a few exceptions where the difference between urban and rural areas is not significant: Ivory Coast, Mauritania, Sri Lanka, Fiji, Korea and Haiti. These remarks are also true of male nuptiality.

Table 2 shows also that, on the whole, urban men marry later than their rural counterparts except in Latin America, Sri Lanka, Fiji and Korea.

4 Educational Attainment

International comparability of data on education is complicated by the diversity of educational systems, the disparity of definitions used and the difference in the quality of education from one country to another. Moreover, only a small number of WFS countries collected information on the educational attainment of their population. This section, therefore, examines only two indicators: attendance at an educational institution at any time, and the level of education attained by the population as indicated by the proportion who have completed at least seven years of schooling.

4.1 SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

Tables A17, A18 and A19 show the percentage of the population aged 7 and over who never attended school, by sex and according to type of place of residence. School attendance is more widespread among males. With the exception of Haiti and Peru, the Latin American countries generally show less inequality between the sexes and school attendance is higher there than elsewhere. In the African countries, and in Bangladesh, Pakistan and Haiti, more than 40 per cent of men and more than 60 per cent of women never attended school. The highest proportions of non-attendance are in Morocco, Bangladesh and Pakistan, affecting 59, 56 and 53 per cent of men and 76, 77 and 82 of women, respectively.

The percentage of non-attendance naturally increases with age for both sexes, and in the older age groups, virtually none of the women in Africa and Asia had ever attended school.

The age group 10–14 is of special interest in the countries where education is not compulsory. This age group generally has the highest enrolment ratios; beyond this age group it is difficult to enter school and before it drop-out figures are minimal. It therefore justifies particular attention, and may be used to assess levels of school attendance.

In the countries studied, the highest percentages of non-attendance at this age were observed, once again, in Bangladesh, Pakistan, Haiti and Morocco, and the lowest percentages in Korea, Philippines, Malaysia, Jordan and Latin America.

Table A20 shows the population aged over 14 with at least seven years of schooling. Despite the differences in educational systems, it is fair to assume that these are people who have at least completed their primary schooling. The inequality in school enrolment between the two sexes outside Latin America is once again confirmed by the figures in this table. Five times as many men as women are shown for Cameroon and Bangladesh, three times as many for Pakistan, and twice as many for Morocco, Sudan and Jordan. The highest percentages of

school enrolment were recorded for Philippines, Panama, Peru and Syria.

4.2 SCHOOL ATTENDANCE AND EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT ACCORDING TO TYPE OF PLACE OF RESIDENCE

Tables A18 and A19 make clear that in all the countries non-attendance is everywhere higher in rural areas, affecting both men and women, but not in equal proportions. It is particularly high in Pakistan and Bangladesh and in Africa, particularly in Morocco, where no rural women in the sample aged 35 and over had attended school at all.

The disparity between town and country is most striking in Latin America where, overall, non-attendance is often three or four times higher in rural areas than in urban areas.

Analysis of the percentages with no schooling at 10–14 years would seem to indicate considerable progress in enrolment in both urban and rural areas. In some countries, such as Jordan, Korea, Malaysia, Philippines and the Latin American countries, urban enrolments approach 100 per cent and there is less difference between urban and rural areas. But in Morocco, Pakistan and Bangladesh, the contrasts will persist. In Morocco, for example, in the 10–14 age group, the enrolment ratios for boys are 92 per cent in urban areas and 44 per cent in rural areas, and the figures for girls are 79 per cent in urban areas and 14 per cent in rural areas.

The most important conclusion to be drawn from this analysis is that in the countries studied, the rural–urban differentiation is more pronounced than the difference in school attendance between boys and girls. It is also notable that in most countries studied, girls in urban areas are more likely to go to school and to stay there longer than boys in rural areas.

Tables A21 and A22 complete this analysis. They show the percentages of the populations with seven years of schooling or more, in urban and rural areas. These tables provide further evidence of the unfavourable position of the rural areas. This finding is hardly surprising. It is known that it is the poor social and educational infrastructure and the general underdevelopment of the rural areas which has led rural residents with some education to migrate to the towns to pursue their studies or seek employment. This explains why the educated sector of the population in developing countries is localized, even concentrated, in urban areas.

Interesting use may be made of the data in tables A17 to A22. The complement to 100 of the figures for each age group in tables A17, A18 and A19 represents the

proportion of the population of the same age and from the same type of place of residence who attended school. The figures in tables A20, A21 and A22 give the proportion of the population of the same age and from the same type of place of residence, with at least seven years of schooling. The ratio of the second figures to the first constitutes a rough measure of the proportion who, having been enrolled for school, completed at least their primary education.

As an example, let us take the 25-29 age group in Bangladesh and the Philippines. Considering only the population of this age group who enrolled for school, let us calculate the proportion who succeeded in completing at least their primary education.

In Bangladesh, the proportion for men is 47 per cent

for the whole country, 68 per cent in urban areas and 44 per cent in rural areas. For women, the figures are 13 per cent for the whole country, 41 per cent in urban areas and 9 per cent in rural areas. In the Philippines, the corresponding proportions for men are 81, 95 and 75 per cent respectively, and for women, 84, 94 and 78 per cent.

Thus, assuming that conditions for the synthetic cohorts have kept constant, the combined use of the data in tables A17, A18 and A19 with the data in tables A20, A21 and A22 allows the measurement of the past proportions of school drop-outs according to age and type of place of residence for each country. These variables can affect, to a large extent, the educational characteristics of the population.

5 Characteristics of Households and Heads of Household

This chapter uses the data in tables A23 to A29 to examine the size, composition and structure of households, and the characteristics of heads of household. In the WFS surveys, a household was usually defined as the entire group of persons who share a dwelling and eat together, irrespective of their relationship. Although often identical with the family, the household is theoretically different, because it is defined with respect to the dwelling unit while the family is defined with respect to the ties of blood, marriage or adoption which link its members.

5.1 HOUSEHOLD SIZE

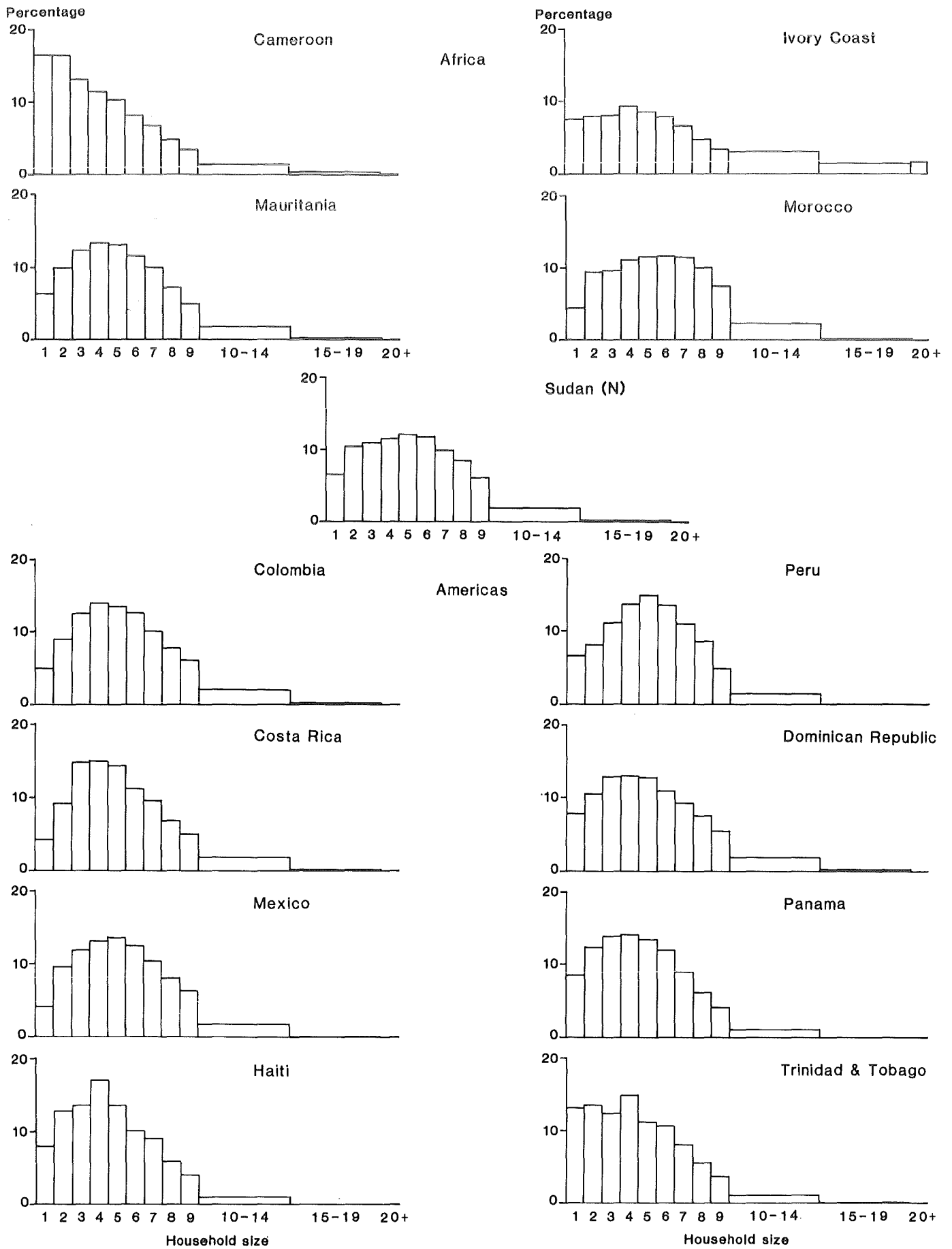


Figure 4 Per cent distribution of households according to *de jure* household size

Household size may be measured by the *de facto* or *de jure* population (figure 4). Whichever is used, tables A23 and A24 show that in most countries the modal household size is five persons. In Syria and Jordan, it is seven. The mean sizes observed range between 7 and 4.7 persons, with the largest recorded in Jordan, Syria and Malaysia, and the smallest in Haiti, Trinidad and Tobago and Korea. In all countries, the proportion of households made up of only one person is small, although it is higher in Africa and Latin America than in Asia. As might be expected, the mean *de jure* size is slightly higher than the mean *de facto* size.

5.2 NUMBER OF MARRIED COUPLES PER HOUSEHOLD

The concept of the married couple is taken here to mean a man and a woman living in a stable union, either as husband and wife or considering themselves as such, and who have been enumerated as members of the same household.

Table A25 and figure 5 give the distribution of households for each country according to the number of married couples making up the household. In all countries, households with only one couple are predominant. In Cameroon, Bangladesh, Nepal, Pakistan, Fiji, Malaysia and Thailand, more than one household in ten is made up of two or more married couples. In Cameroon, Sudan and Latin America, where the dissolution of unions is frequent, households which do not include a married couple are particularly frequent. This type of household is made up either of a single person, or of several persons not related in any way, or a formerly married person, and children. In these countries the mean number of married couples per household is somewhat low and usually smaller than unity: between 0.77 and 0.89.

5.3 NUMBER OF GENERATIONS IN THE HOUSEHOLD

Table A26 gives the distribution of households according to the number of generations and shows that most households have members belonging to two generations. Usually, these generations are that of the head of the household and that of his children. In Cameroon and Sudan, however, nearly three households out of ten only contain one generation. In the Asian countries, on the other hand, particularly in Bangladesh, Nepal, Pakistan, Malaysia, Sri Lanka and Thailand, nearly a quarter of all households includes three generations – normally the generation of the head of household, that of his children and that of his parents. As a result, the mean number of generations is high: 2.20 in Bangladesh and Pakistan, 2.19 in Thailand, 2.14 in Sri Lanka and 2.11 in Malaysia.

5.4 HOUSEHOLD STRUCTURE

Households can be classified into two categories: those including at least one married couple and those not. In this report, a household including at least one married couple is further subdivided according to the number and relationship of other married couples:

- **nuclear** if it consists of only one couple;
- **vertically extended** if it is made up of a married couple and both parents of the husband and/or the wife;
- **laterally extended** if it includes, as well as the married couple, at least one (married) brother or sister of the husband or wife.

A further possibility is that a family may be extended both laterally and vertically.

This section describes briefly the distribution of households according to the type of family. The per cent distribution of households according to household structure is shown in figure 6.

As the data of table A27 show, in all the countries studied the majority of households are made up of nuclear families or vertically extended families. This confirms the results of the analysis of the distribution of households according to the number of generations. The presence of laterals or collaterals is significant only in Cameroon and, to a lesser extent, in Bangladesh, Nepal, Pakistan and Malaysia. In these four last countries, nearly three per cent of households are made up of extended families in the traditional sense, that is, they include in addition to the couple, ascendants,

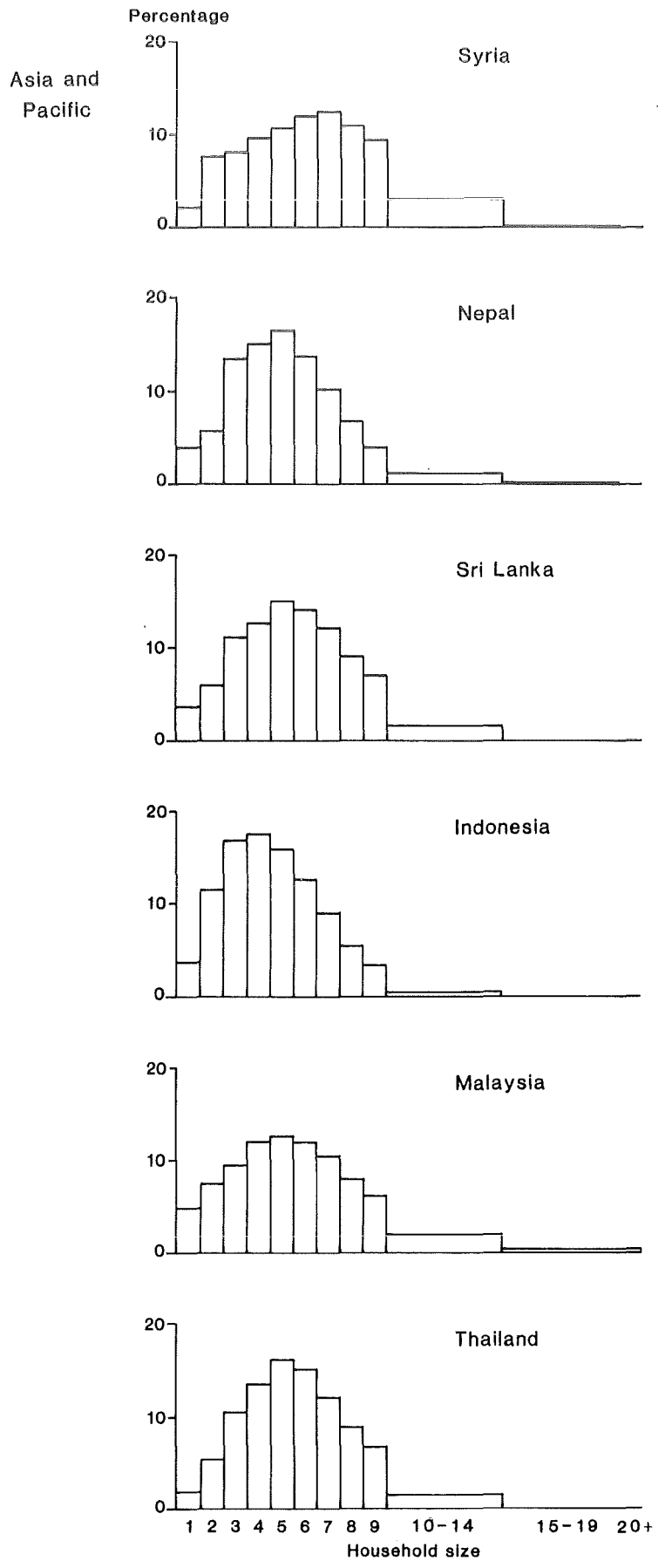
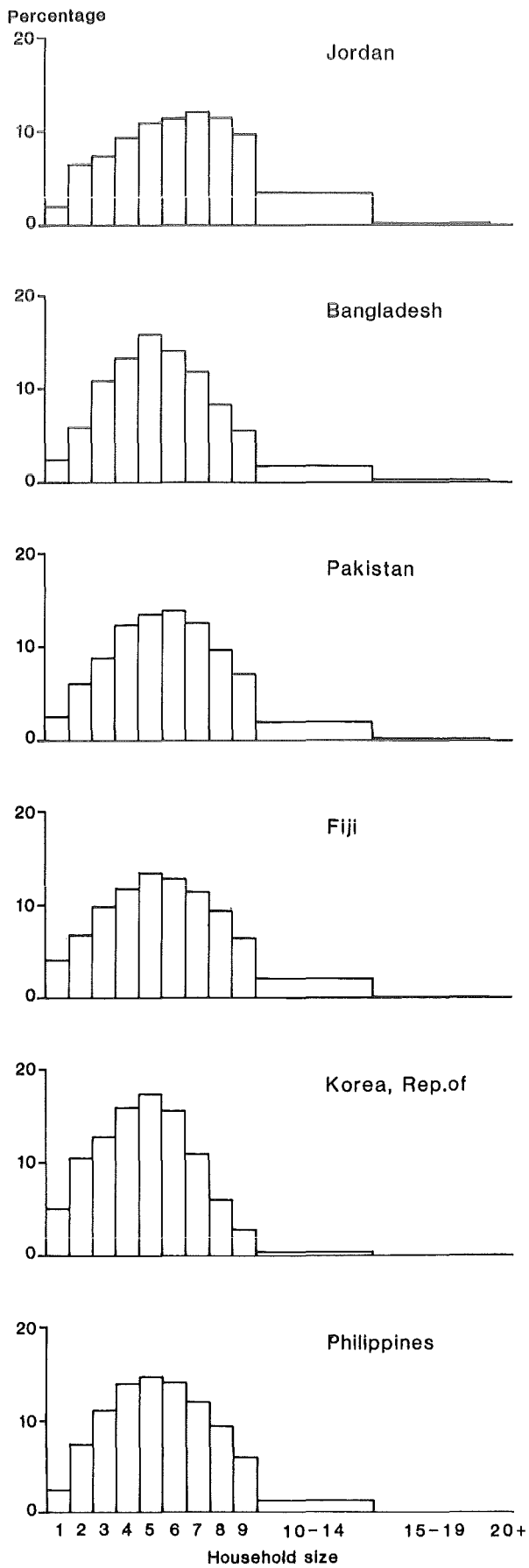
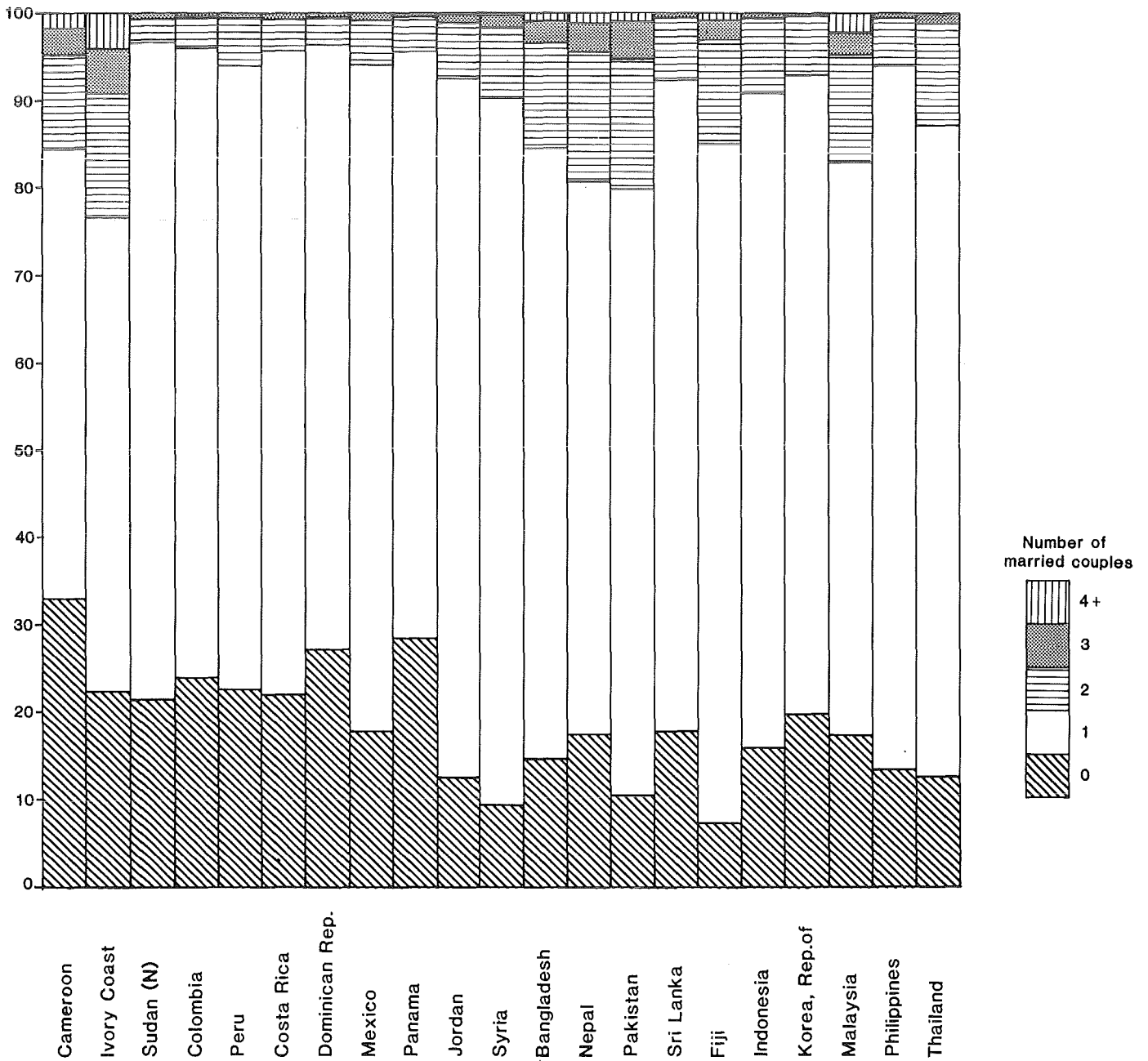


Figure 4 (cont)

Two or more married couples per household

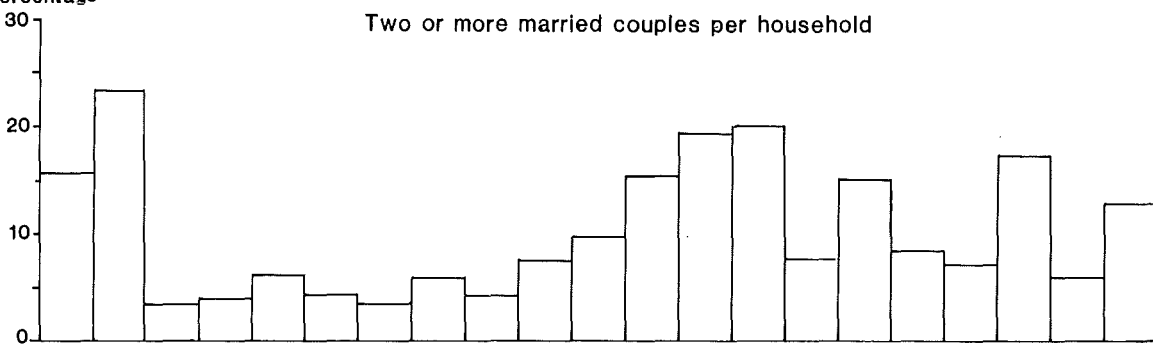
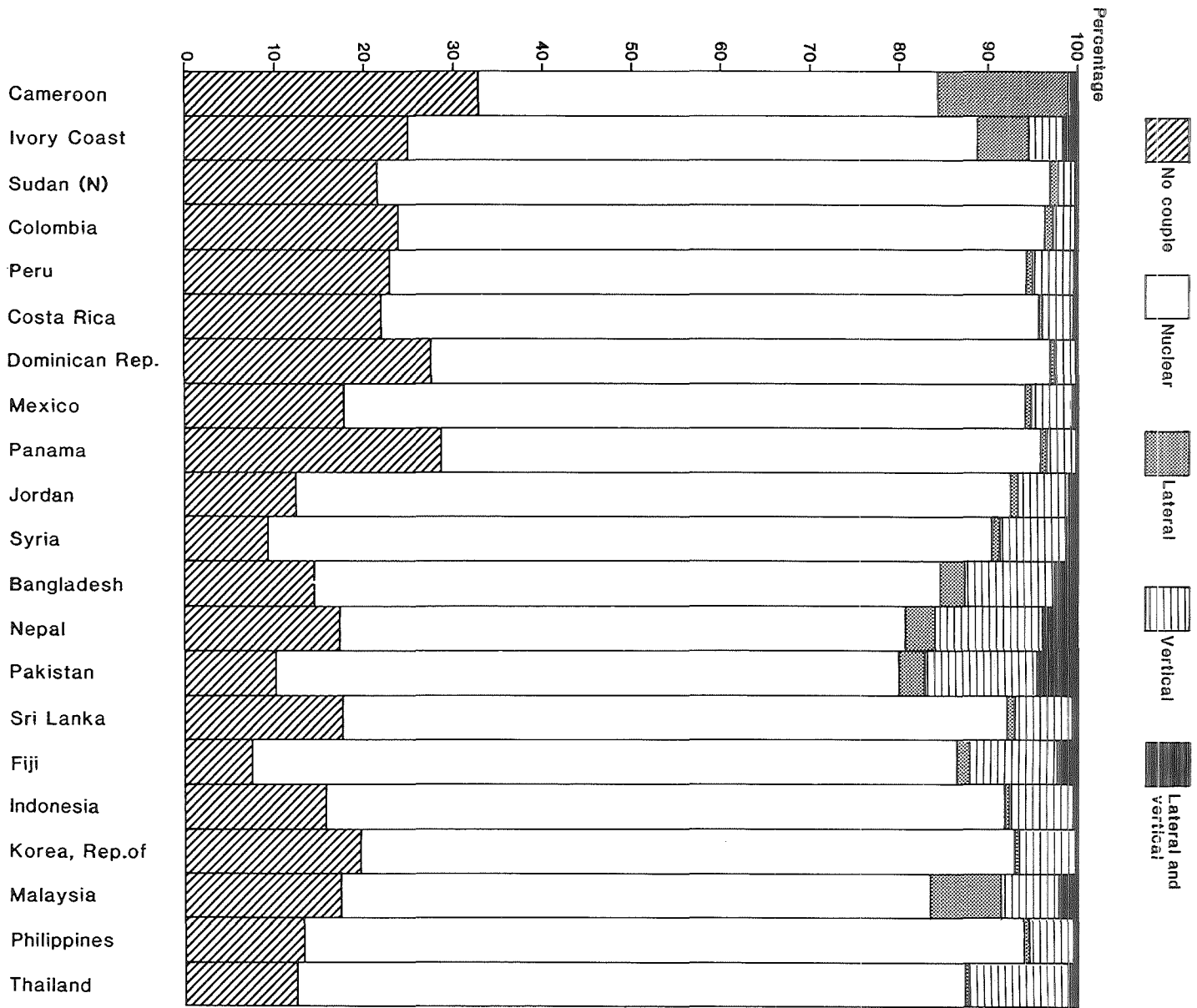


Figure 5 Per cent distribution of married couples in the household

descendants, laterals and collaterals. With the exception of Cameroon, the least common type of household is the laterally extended household.

5.5 HOUSEHOLD CHARACTERISTICS IN URBAN AND RURAL AREAS

Tables A23–A27 also present the characteristics of households according to the type of place of residence.

Only Nepal and Malaysia show significant differences in the mean sizes observed in urban and rural areas: 6.1 in urban areas as against 5.2, and 8.4 as against 5.8 respectively. But it must be remembered that in Nepal, which is one of the least urbanized countries in the world (5 per cent of the population in 1983), the survey covered only 146 urban households. The mean size in urban areas may therefore have been affected by sample fluctuation.

The mean number of married couples per household in urban areas is slightly smaller than in rural areas. This difference is probably due to the high proportion of households without any married couple in urban areas, particularly in Latin America. In the same way, rural households, particularly in the Latin American countries, appear to include a larger number of generations.

These small differences between urban and rural areas are, however, insufficient to give either area distinctive characteristics. The main characteristics of households at the national level, as described above, may be taken to apply to households in both urban and rural areas.

5.6 CHARACTERISTICS OF HEADS OF HOUSEHOLD

Table A28 gives the characteristics of age, sex and marital status of heads of household.

The head of household is the person who is recognized as such by the other household members. Most questionnaires did not include any particular questions addressed specifically to the head of household or intended to identify him or her. In the event, therefore, the head of

household identified himself or was identified as such to the interviewer, and by reference to whom the relationships with each of the members of the household were defined.

As expected, heads of household are primarily men, married, and usually aged 20 or over. As age increases, however, the proportion of men among the heads of household declines in favour of women. Divorce and particularly widowhood are responsible for making women heads of household.

Women are least represented among heads of household, even at older ages, in Morocco, Jordan, Syria, Pakistan and Bangladesh. But in Latin America, Cameroon and especially Mauritania, where dissolution of marriages is more common at all ages, women are more often heads of household. In Mauritania, nearly one head of household in four is a woman. In these countries, too, a relatively high proportion of married women under age 50 was observed among the female heads of household: of the 20–24 age group, 25 per cent in Mauritania, 17 per cent in Haiti and 11 per cent in Trinidad and Tobago.

Table A29 gives the mean household size according to marital status and/or the age of the head of household. The households whose head has never married or is widowed, separated or divorced, have the smallest mean size.

In the first case, the heads of household would normally be young people who have not yet started their own families, and the majority of members of the household belong to the same generation as the head.

In the second case, they would on the contrary be elderly people, either men or women, whose children have already left home to set up their own households, or young women, divorced or separated, with a number of small children.

The presence in the household of members belonging to the generation of grandchildren is only significant in the households where the head is widowed, divorced or separated. The generation of the children of the head of household is only highly predominant in cases where the head is currently married.

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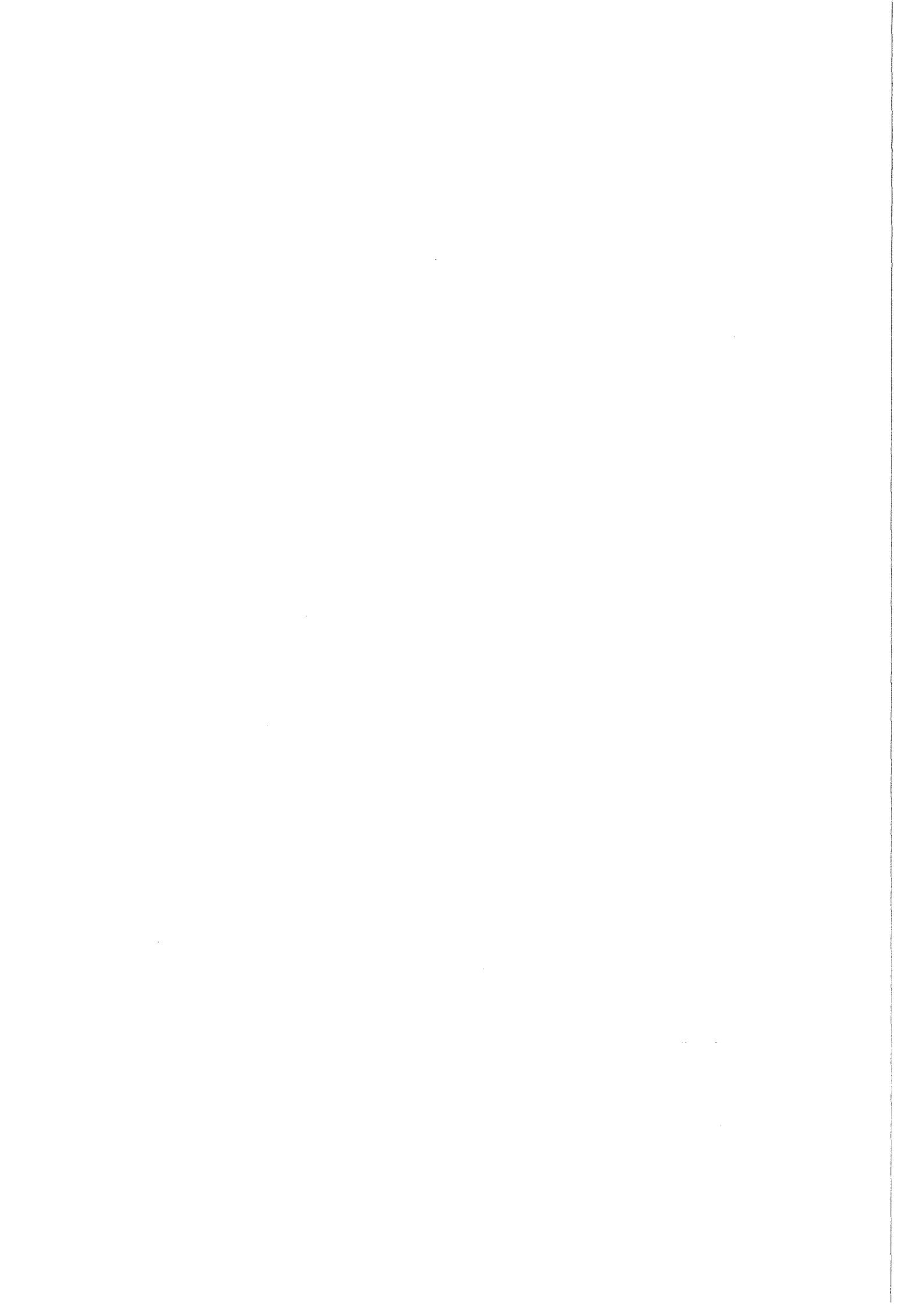
